Schedule A

Terms of the Last Exemption (as set out at 7.1(a) of the Notice to Grant a Temporary Exemption to Carnival dated 17 October 2019)

Terms of the Exemption

Carnival may impose the following restrictions, based on age, in relation to its cruises commencing in Australia:

- 1. For Carnival cruise-ships departing an Australian port between 1 November and 7 January, Carnival will permit a quota of 20 passengers per cruise who are under the age of 19 and not accompanied by a responsible adult. Once this quota is filled, Carnival will require passengers who are under the age of 19 to be accompanied by a responsible adult (Responsible Adult Requirement).
- 2. For Carnival cruise-ships departing an Australian port between 8 January and 31 January, Carnival will permit a quota of 60 passengers per cruise who are under the age of 19 and not accompanied by a responsible adult. Once this quota is filled, Carnival will apply its Responsible Adult Requirement.
- 3. The quotas, in 1 and 2 above, will not include infants and will also not include passengers under the age of 17 where Carnival considers that the minor does not present a risk of participating in an Unauthorised Event. Carnival will otherwise determine how the quota in each period is filled.

Carnival may, in its sole and absolute discretion, increase the quota in either or both periods, where it decides that the increase will not result in a risk to health, safety and security of the passengers and crew, having regard to the purpose of its policy.

Carnival may, at its sole and absolute discretion, waive the Responsible Adult Requirement where it is satisfied that a specific passenger under the age of 19 does not present a risk of participating in an Unauthorised Event. Carnival may require any such passenger to sign a code of conduct or provide other commitments as a condition of boarding.

Where the Responsible Adult Requirement is mentioned in Carnival's advertising or online booking system, Carnival will clearly state that it can decide to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement. Carnival will state that prospective passengers can apply to Carnival for a waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement and will provide information about how an application for a waiver can be lodged. Carnival will provide clear publicly available information regarding the factors it considers when making decisions about waiver applications. This information will be provided at the time of booking. Carnival will also state that requests for review in relation to a waiver application decision can be made through its complaint handling process and will publish information about this process.

Carnival will assess each application for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement that it receives (when the relevant quota is filled, and it becomes applicable).

Carnival will continue operating its complaint handling mechanism to allow applicants who are dissatisfied with Carnival's initial assessment on a waiver application to further engage with Carnival on the matter, and Carnival will participate in that process in good faith.

AUSTRALIAN HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION AGE DISCRIMINATION ACT 2004 (CTH), section 44(1) NOTICE TO GRANT A TEMPORARY EXEMPTION

By this instrument, the Australian Human Rights Commission ('Commission') grants the application of Carnival plc (trading as Carnival Australia) for a temporary exemption pursuant to s 44(1) of the *Age Discrimination Act 2004* (Cth) ('ADA').

BACKGROUND

Carnival plc (trading as Carnival Australia) (the 'Applicant') is a cruise company and operator of 12 cruise brands, including P&O Cruises Australia and Princess Cruises Australia.

Nature of application

(a) Description of the Applicant's proposed policy

The Applicant has applied for a temporary exemption under the ADA in respect of a policy to prevent Unauthorised Events occurring on its cruise ships which are likely to compromise the health, safety and security of passengers and crew.

The Applicant's policy defines an Unauthorised Event as any event which may be large in scale, and which is associated with excessive or anti-social behaviour, including the abuse of alcohol. The Applicant's policy specifically identifies a 'Schoolies' event as an example of an Unauthorised Event. The Commission notes that term 'Schoolies' events generally refers to celebrations by young people who have either just finished their last year of high school, or who are celebrating with other young people who have just finished their last year of high school.

(b) Restrictions based on age in the Applicant's policy

The Applicant wishes to impose the following restrictions based on age on Applicant cruises commencing from Australia:

- for Applicant cruise ships departing an Australian port between 1 November and
 7 January annually, passengers who are under the age of 19 must be accompanied by a responsible adult (the 'Responsible Adult Requirement'); and
- for Applicant cruise ships departing an Australian port between 8 January and 31 January annually, the Applicant will permit a quota of 60 passengers per cruise who are under 19 years of age and not accompanied by a responsible adult. After this quota is filled, the Applicant will apply its requirement that passengers under 19 years of age must be accompanied by a responsible adult.

In respect of the first restriction, the Applicant may, at its own initiative, waive the Responsible Adult Requirement where it is satisfied (in its sole and absolute discretion) that there is no risk that a specific passenger under the age of 19 will participate in an Unauthorised Event. The Applicant may require any such passenger to sign a code of conduct or provide other commitments as a condition of boarding. This discretion may be exercised by the Applicant on a case by case basis. The

Applicant will not (and is not required to) make an assessment of each and every case.

In respect of the latter restriction, the Applicant notes that the quota will not include infants, and will also not include passengers under the age of 17 where the Applicant believes there is no risk that the minor will participate in an Unauthorised Event. The Applicant will otherwise determine how the quota is filled.

The Applicant may, in its sole and absolute discretion, increase this quota where it decides that this increase will not result in a risk to health, safety and security of passengers and crew, having regard to the purpose of the Applicant's policy.

(c) The Applicant's proposed general right of refusal in relation to all of its cruises

Where the Applicant forms the view, on reasonable grounds, that a passenger (of any age) is planning to participate in an Unauthorised Event, the Applicant may refuse boarding to that passenger or impose other conditions aimed at reducing or eliminating any risk to the health, safety and security of passengers and crew. Those conditions include requiring the passenger to sign a code of conduct or provide other commitments as a condition of boarding.

This restriction applies in respect of any Applicant cruise ship departing from an Australia port at any time of the year. The restrictions based on age, outlined in paragraph (b) above, are not intended to limit the operation of this general right of refusal.

Applicant's reasons for requesting an exemption

The Applicant is seeking to prevent events occurring on board its cruise ships which compromise the Applicant's ability to ensure the health, safety and security of passengers and crew. The Applicant is particularly concerned about 'Schoolies' celebrations on board its cruise ships and has outlined its ongoing concern about the risk of secondary supply of alcohol on board its cruise ships to passengers under the age of 18.

Until 2007, the Applicant operated 'Schoolies' cruises which catered exclusively for passengers aged 16 to 19 years of age celebrating the end of their high school education. The Applicant states that it discontinued these cruises because of an exponential increase in alcohol-related security incidents during the cruises. While the Applicant discontinued its 'Schoolies' cruises and its marketing towards school leavers, the Applicant states that there has continued to be a high level of school-leavers seeking to book cruises during the summer months.

In 2009, the Applicant made an application to the Commission for a temporary exemption under the ADA to permit it to operate an 'under-21s' policy. The Applicant's under-21s policy was to require all persons under the age of 21 to travel with a parent or guardian on Applicant cruise ships between 1 November and 30 January each year. The Applicant sought the under-21s policy to address its concerns about 'Schoolies' celebrations on board its cruise ships, and submitted that it had tried all other reasonable measures open to it, without success.

The Commission declined to grant that temporary exemption application. One of the Commission's reasons was that the scope of the requested exemption was significantly broader than its intended purpose. The objective of the under-21s policy was to discourage school leavers from taking cruises during the traditional 'Schoolies' period. The effect of the under-21s policy was to exclude all persons under the age of 21, regardless of whether they were school leavers, university students or in full-time employment.

The Applicant has submitted a revised temporary exemption application whose restrictions correspond more closely with the type of behaviour it is seeking to address.

REASONS FOR DECISION

The Commission has decided to grant the application. The reasons for the Commission's decision are as follows.

The Applicant's policy pursues a legitimate public policy goal and is appropriately targeted in its approach

The Commission accepts the Applicant's health, safety and security concerns regarding 'Schoolies' celebrations, including the risk of secondary supply of alcohol to passengers under the age of 18, and the difficulty in preventing this as the number of people involved in the celebration increases. Considering that the secondary supply of alcohol contravenes the Applicant's RSA policies and obligations and raises a significant risk to the health, safety and security of passengers, the Responsible Adult Requirement is an appropriate response to that concern.

The Commission considers that limiting the Responsible Adult Requirement to passengers under the age of 19, instead of the Applicant's earlier proposal of applying the Responsible Adult Requirement to all passengers under the age of 21, is an appropriately targeted approach.

The Commission also considers that the Applicant's proposal to introduce an adjustable quota of unaccompanied passengers under the age of 19 on cruises between 8 January and 31 January narrows the application of the Responsible Adult Requirement to a period which more closely resembles the traditional period for 'Schoolies' celebrations.

Finally, the Commission notes that the Applicant's policy provides for a waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement. This waiver recognises that there will be passengers under the age of 19 who do not present a risk of participating in an Unauthorised Event and thus should not be subject to the limitation.

Having regard to the objects of the ADA, the Applicant's policy is a reasonable measure

In making a determination on a temporary exemption application under the ADA, the Commission has regard to the objects of the Act. The objects of the ADA include seeking to eliminate, as far as possible, discrimination against persons on the ground of age in a range of areas, including provision of goods, services and facilities and accommodation.

The Commission recognises that the Applicant's policy allows conduct which is inconsistent with the objects of the ADA. While this is a factor which suggests against the grant of the exemption sought,¹ it does not mean that the Commission cannot grant the exemption. In line with the Commission's guidelines on the granting of temporary exemption under the ADA, the Commission has considered the reasonableness of the Applicant's policy, weighing up the nature and extent of the discriminatory effect against the reasons advanced in favour of the exemption.²

The Commission has taken into account the Applicant's legitimate concern about controlling the consumption of alcohol on board its cruises and its previous experience of 'Schoolies' celebrations. The Commission has also taken into account the Applicant's substantial narrowing of its earlier proposal. In the Commission's view, the Applicant's policy is a reasonable measure which should be permitted. The Applicant has sought to minimise as far as possible the discriminatory effect of its policy by reducing both the age range and the time period of the Responsible Adult Requirement and by making it subject to exceptions in appropriate cases.

TERM OF EXEMPTION

The Commission grants the temporary exemption for a term of 2.5 years, commencing on 23 December 2010 and expiring on 22 June 2013.

APPLICATION FOR REVIEW

AUSTRALIAN HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION AGE DISCRIMINATION ACT 2004 (CTH), S 44(2) NOTICE OF GRANT OF A TEMPORARY EXEMPTION

By this instrument, under section 44(2) of the *Age Discrimination Act 2004* (Cth)(ADA), the Australian Human Rights Commission grants an exemption to Carnival plc, trading as Carnival Australia (Carnival), from the operation of section 28 of the ADA.

This exemption is granted for a period of two and half years from the date of this instrument and is subject to the conditions outlined below.

SUMMARY

Carnival is a cruise company which operates cruises to the Pacific Islands from Australia and New Zealand.

On 7 April 2009, Carnival applied for an exemption under the ADA to implement a strategy for managing security issues which were arising on its cruises at the time of the 'Schoolies Period'. The core aspects of this strategy, for which the exemption was sought, were, inter alia:

- a) requiring that any passengers under the age of 19 years, travelling in the period 1 November to 7 January, be accompanied by a responsible adult (subject to waiver by Carnival); and
- b) restricting to 60 (subject to any increase at Carnival's discretion) the number of unsupervised passengers under the age of 19 years on-board any cruise in the period 8 January to 31 January.

On 23 December 2010, the Commission granted to Carnival an exemption for two and a half years (Initial Exemption).

On 21 June 2013, Carnival applied to the Commission for an extension of the Initial Exemption, on the same terms, for a further period of two and a half years (Application). The exemption is granted subject to further conditions. The terms of the exemption are set out below.

BACKGROUND

Carnival relies on the same reasons for seeking the further exemption as it relied on in its Initial Exemption application in April 2009.

In support of the further Application, Carnival has also included data relevant to its implementation of the Initial Exemption.

Reasons for initial application

Carnival states that prior to lodging the Initial Exemption application it experienced a high level of alcohol-fuelled and other security incidents on-board its cruises in the traditional 'Schoolies Period', which it defines as 1 November to 31 January (Schoolies Period).

Up until 2006, Carnival operated 'Schoolies' cruises, which were marketed exclusively to passengers aged 16 to 19 years celebrating the end of their high school education. However, these 'Schoolies' cruises became problematic due to the large number of alcohol-related and other security incidents involving a large number of school-leavers (Schoolies). These incidents included serious risks to the health and safety of passengers, crew and the Schoolies participants themselves.

Carnival attempted to reduce the number and severity of these incidents by obtaining the advice of security experts and implementing a range of security measures, such as restricting access to alcohol, increasing security presence on-board its cruises and increasing pre-boarding / on-boarding searches for contraband alcohol. Despite these various measures, Carnival advised that it continued to experience a large number of alcohol-fuelled incidents involving Schoolies.

Sometime in 2006, Carnival made a decision to discontinue promoting its cruises to school leavers. However, Carnival advised that even after this step was taken, there continued to be large numbers of school-leavers booking cruises and it continued to experience alcohol-fuelled and other 'Schoolies' incidents.

Reasons for further Application

Carnival advises that since the Commission granted the Initial Exemption, it has observed a significant decrease in the number of alcohol-related security incidents during the Schoolies Period. Carnival considers that this decrease is attributable to the Initial Exemption granted by the Commission in December 2010.

By way of example, Carnival states that:

- in December 2005, it recorded 457 separate security incidents on one cruise-ship, during one cruise;
- in December 2012, it recorded a total of 67 security incidents, across its four cruiseships in all cruises for that month.

Carnival also states that the Initial Exemption has served to:

- discourage Schoolies from making bookings for the purpose of engaging in improper behaviour and under-age drinking;
- reduce the likelihood of unmanageable large-scale 'Schoolies' events organised through means such as social networking;

 promote an understanding that Carnival cruises will not tolerate improper behaviour and under-age drinking on its cruise-ships as part of the Schoolies Period celebrations.

In seeking the further exemption, Carnival emphasises the primacy of health, safety and security of its crew and passengers. It states that health and safety risks on its cruise-ships are compounded by the following factors:

- the on-board environment contains inherent risks, including risks associated with confined spaces and falling from heights or into the ocean;
- while at sea, its cruise-ships are isolated from emergency medical services and there are limited on-board medical facilities;
- while at sea, it cannot call upon an immediately available police presence;
- there are practical limitations to security personnel numbers which it can accommodate on its cruises:
- on-board security personnel are limited in terms of:
 - their rights to detain, search and control passengers; and
 - the facilities available for detaining passengers who are a threat to themselves and/or others:
- past experience shows that Schoolies participants have a remarkable ingenuity for circumventing its procedures in relation to restricting access to and the consumption of alcohol;
- past experience shows that Schoolies' celebrations involve large groups organised through school and social networking, and these groups seek to run events/gatherings on-board which are difficult to manage.

Data from the Initial Exemption period

In support of its reasons as to why the further exemption should be granted, Carnival has included relevant data and feedback for the period 2010 – 2013, in relation to the following matters:

- how many Carnival cruises departed from Australian ports in the Schoolies Period;
- how many young people (aged 16-18 years inclusive) were on-board each of the cruise-ships which departed in the Schoolies Period;
- how many young people, on the cruise-ships which departed in the Schoolies Period, were accompanied by an adult and how many were unaccompanied;
- incidents of anti-social behaviour on its cruise-ships during the Schoolies Period;

- how frequently Carnival waived the responsible adult requirement, applicable in the period 1 November to 7 January; and
- how frequently Carnival increased the 60 passenger quota, applicable in the period 8 January to 31 January.

Submissions received by the Commission

Carnival's request for a further temporary exemption was posted on the Commission's website and interested parties were invited to comment on the Application.¹ The Commission also circulated the Application to:

- a) all State and Territory anti-discrimination bodies;
- b) the New South Wales Police Marine Area Command; and
- c) the Alcohol and Other Drugs Council of Australia.

The Commission received four submissions in response to the Application. Each of these has been posted on the Commission's website.²

The Equal Opportunity Commission of Western Australia did not express a view on whether the Commission should grant the exemption, but noted that:

- it would still be statutorily bound to investigate any complaint alleging a breach of the age discrimination provisions of the Equal Opportunity Act 1984 (WA) (EO Act); and
- if the exception under section 66ZM of the EO Act did not apply to Carnival's circumstances, Carnival should consider making an exemption application under the EO Act through the State Administrative Tribunal of Western Australia.

The Anti-Discrimination Commission of Queensland (ADCQ) advised that it had no objection to the Commission granting the further exemption. ADCQ stated that the material set out in the Application supported Carnival's policy and indicated that it was a reasonable measure for a legitimate public interest.

The Alcohol and Other Drugs Council of Australia (ADCA) made a submission in support of the exemption. The ADCA stated that its support is based on strong evidence which shows that people in the 16-18 age group should not be drinking at levels which are often reached when drinking in groups. It also noted that the general risks associated with young people drinking are compounded by the dangers alcohol may pose in the potentially high-risk marine environment.

The Anti-Discrimination-Board of New South Wales (ADBNSW) made a submission which did not support the grant of the exemption. The ADBNSW stated that the age restriction was discriminatory towards people of a particular age group, whether they are accompanied by a responsible adult or not. Its main concern was that the exemption

appeared to be inconsistent with the purposes of the ADA; in its view, the age restriction does not provide a bona fide benefit to persons of a particular age, does not intend to meet a need that arises out of the age of a person and nor is it intended to reduce the disadvantage experienced by people of a particular age. The ADBNSW also noted that the restrictions in Carnival's Initial Exemption, and the application of the restrictions at the sole discretion of Carnival, leaves open the potential of discrimination under other grounds, and this observation is based on the substance and number of complaints which the ADBNSW receives from young people.

RELEVANT LAW

The Commission may grant an exemption from the operation of a provision of Division 2 or 3 of Part 4 of the ADA.³ An exemption may be granted subject to terms and conditions specified in the instrument and may be expressed to apply only in circumstances, or in relation to particular activities, as specified in the instrument.⁴ Exemptions are to be granted for a specified period not exceeding five years.⁵ It is not unlawful for a person to act in accordance with an exemption.6

Pursuant to section 28 of the ADA, it is unlawful to discriminate on the ground of age in the provision of goods, services or facilities. This provision is located in Division 3 of Part 4 of the ADA. Therefore, the Commission may grant Carnival an exemption from the operation of section 28 of the ADA.

DECISION AND REASONS

The Commission has decided to grant an exemption to Carnival from section 28 of the ADA on the terms set out below, in order to allow Carnival to implement its age restriction policy which has the aim of preventing 'Unauthorised Events' occurring on its cruise-ships.

Carnival's policy defines an 'Unauthorised Event' as any event which may be large in scale and which is associated with excessive or anti-social behaviour, including the abuse of alcohol (Unauthorised Event). Carnival's policy identifies a 'Schoolies Event' as an example of an Unauthorised Event. The Commission notes that the term 'Schoolies Event' generally refers to celebrations by young people who have just finished their last year of high school, or who are celebrating with other young people who have just finished their last year of high school.

Terms of the Exemption

Carnival may impose the following restrictions, based on age, in relation to its cruises commencing in Australia:

1. For Carnival cruise-ships departing an Australian port between 1 November and 7 January annually, passengers who are under the age of 19 must be accompanied by a responsible adult (Responsible Adult Requirement).

Carnival may, at its sole discretion, waive the Responsible Adult Requirement where it is satisfied (in its sole and absolute discretion) that there is no risk that a specific passenger under the age of 19 will participate in an Unauthorised Event. Carnival may require any such passenger to sign a code of conduct or provide other commitments as a condition of boarding.

Where the Responsible Adult Requirement is mentioned in Carnival's advertising or online booking system, Carnival will also state that it has retained a discretion to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement.

This discretion may be exercised by Carnival on a case by case basis and Carnival is not required to make an assessment of each and every case, nor is Carnival required to engage in a review process of any decision in relation to its exercise of the discretion.

2. For Carnival cruise-ships departing an Australian port between 8 January and 31 January annually, Carnival will permit a quota of 60 passengers per cruise who are under the age of 19 and not accompanied by a responsible adult. Once this quota is filled, Carnival will apply its Responsible Adult Requirement.

The quota will not include infants and will also not include passengers under the age of 17, where Carnival believes there is no risk that the minor will participate in an Unauthorised Event. Carnival will otherwise determine how the quota is filled.

Carnival may, in its sole and absolute discretion, increase this quota where it decides that the increase will not result in a risk to health, safety and security of the passengers and crew, having regard to the purpose of its policy.

Carnival will retain an absolute discretion to accept or reject any application/request for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement (where the quota is filled and it becomes applicable). It will not be required to engage in a review process of any decision in relation to its exercise of the discretion.

Conditions

This exemption is subject to the following conditions:

- a) Carnival will report to the Commission at the end of this exemption period, how many applications/requests for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement it receives for the 1 November – 7 January period and how many of these applications/requests it approves.
- b) Carnival will report to the Commission at the end of this exemption period
 - how many applications/requests it receives for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement during the 8 January – 31 January period, once the quota is filled; and
 - ii. on how many occasions and to what number it increases the quota.

Period of Exemption

The exemption is granted for a period of two and half years from the date of this instrument.

Reasons for Decision

The reasons for the Commission's decision to grant the exemption are as follows.

Carnival's policy pursues a legitimate public policy goal and is appropriately targeted in its approach

The Commission accepts Carnival's health, safety and security concerns regarding Schoolies celebrations on its cruises, including:

- the risk of secondary supply of alcohol to passengers under the age of 18 and the
 difficulty of preventing this. Considering that the secondary supply of alcohol
 contravenes Carnival's RSA policies and obligations, and raises a significant risk to
 the health, safety and security of passengers, the Responsible Adult Requirement is
 an appropriate response to that concern;
- the ability of Schoolies to organise unmanageable large-scale events through means such as social networking;
- the limited capacity of on-board medical facilities in the event of accidents and the
 risks of accidents occurring (such as falling from heights on a cruise-ship or into the
 ocean). The Commission also notes the submission of ADCA that general risks
 associated with young people drinking are compounded by the dangers alcohol
 may pose in the potentially high-risk marine environment;
- the inability to call upon a police presence in the management of issues which may arise as a result of Unauthorised Events; and
- the limitations facing on-board security personnel in the management of issues which may arise as a result of Unauthorised Events.

The Commission considers that the parameters Carnival has set in relation to the Responsible Adult Requirement make it an appropriately targeted approach. Specifically, the Commission has had regard to the Responsible Adult Requirement being:

a) Appropriately targeted in terms of age.

The Responsible Adult Requirement is limited to passengers under the age of 19 years and, in respect of the restrictions in the period 8 January – 31 January, it does not include passengers under the age of 17 where Carnival believes there is no risk that the minor will participate in an Unauthorised Event.

b) Appropriately targeted in terms of its periods of application.

The Responsible Adult Requirement is applied more strictly in the period 1 November – 7 January, where passengers under the age of 19 are not able to

travel unless accompanied by a responsible adult. This period closely resembles the traditional period for 'Schoolies' celebrations.

The Responsible Adult Requirement is applied less strictly in the period 8 January – 31 January, during which time Carnival applies the adjustable quota restriction. The Commission notes that during the Initial Exemption period, Carnival has on one occasion increased the quota of 60 to 68 and that it has not been necessary to consider increasing the quota on other occasions as Carnival has not had more than 60 passengers under the age of 19 seek to make bookings during the relevant period.

c) Appropriately targeted in terms of its flexibility in application.

Carnival's policy provides for a waiver (at its discretion) of the Responsible Adult Requirement. Carnival will state in its advertising and online booking system that it has retained this waiver discretion.

The ability to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement recognises that there will be passengers under the age of 19 who do not present a risk of participating in an Unauthorised Event and thus should not be subject to the limitation.

Carnival's policy is a reasonable measure having regard to the objects of the ADA

In making a determination on a temporary exemption application under the ADA, the Commission has regard to the objects of the ADA. The objects of the ADA include seeking to eliminate, as far as possible, discrimination against persons on the ground of age in a range of areas, including provision of goods, services or facilities.

The Commission recognises that Carnival's policy allows conduct which is inconsistent with the objects of the ADA. While this is a factor weighing against the grant of the exemption sought, it does not mean that the Commission cannot grant the exemption. In line with the Commission's Guidelines on the granting of a temporary exemption under the ADA, the Commission has assessed:

- the reasonableness of Carnival's policy, weighing up the nature and extent of the discriminatory effect against the reasons advanced in favour of the exemption; and
- whether the exemption could be granted subject to terms and conditions which further the objects of the ADA.

In undertaking this assessment, the Commission has considered the following:

- a) Carnival's legitimate concerns about controlling the consumption of alcohol onboard its cruises and its previous difficulties in managing the health, safety and security issues associated with 'Schoolies' celebrations;
- b) Carnival's submissions regarding the effectiveness of the Initial Exemption in reducing security incidents on-board its cruises;

- c) Carnival has minimised the discriminatory impact of its policy by making it appropriately targeted in its application (noting the parameters of the Responsible Adult Requirement, discussed above) and has thereby limited its discriminatory effect;
- d) Carnival's application of the Responsible Adult Requirement during the Initial Exemption period shows that Carnival has:
 - i. in relation to the 1 November 7 January period, at least in one case exercised its discretion to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement for people under the age of 19; and
 - ii. in relation to the 8 January 31 January period, increased the quota in one case.

This indicates that Carnival has at least in some cases accommodated the individual circumstances of particular young people and this contributes to the reasonableness of the policy;

e) The additional terms of this further exemption, that Carnival will state in its advertising and online booking system the existence of its discretion to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement, will further reduce the discriminatory impact of the exemption as young people will be aware of the flexible operation of Carnival's age restriction policy.

The Commission concludes that Carnival's policy is a reasonable measure which should be permitted, having weighed up the nature and extent of the discriminatory effect against the reasons in favour of the exemption.

APPLICATION FOR REVIEW

Subject to the *Administrative Appeals Tribunal Act 1975* (Cth), any person whose interests are affected by this decision may apply to the Administrative Appeals Tribunal for a review of the decision.

AUSTRALIAN HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION AGE DISCRIMINATION ACT 2004 (CTH), S 44(2) NOTICE OF GRANT OF A TEMPORARY EXEMPTION

By this instrument, under section 44(2) of the *Age Discrimination Act 2004* (Cth) (ADA), the Australian Human Rights Commission grants an exemption to Carnival plc, trading as Carnival Australia (Carnival), from the operation of section 28 of the ADA.

This exemption is granted for a period of one year from the date of this instrument and is subject to the conditions outlined below.

Summary

Carnival is a cruise company that operates cruises to the Pacific Islands from Australia and New Zealand.

On 7 April 2009, Carnival applied for an exemption under the ADA to implement a strategy for managing security issues, which were arising on its cruises at the time of the 'Schoolies Period'. The core aspects of this strategy, for which the exemption was sought, were, inter alia:

- 1. requiring that any passengers under the age of 19 years, travelling in the period 1 November to 7 January, be accompanied by a responsible adult (subject to waiver by Carnival) (The Responsible Adult Requirement); and
- 2. restricting to 60 (subject to any increase at Carnival's discretion) the number of unsupervised passengers under the age of 19 years on-board any cruise in the period 8 January to 31 January (Quota Restriction).

On 23 December 2010, the Commission granted to Carnival an exemption for two and a half years (Initial Exemption).

On 21 June 2013, Carnival applied to the Commission for an extension of the Initial Exemption, on the same terms, for a further period of two and a half years (2013 Exemption). On 15 November 2013 the further exemption was granted subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Carnival will report to the Commission at the end of the exemption period, how many applications/requests for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement it receives for the 1 November 7 January period and how many of these applications/requests it approves; and
- 2. Carnival will report to the Commission at the end of the exemption period

- a) how many applications/requests it receives for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement during the 8 January 31 January period, once the quota is filled; and
- b) on how many occasions and to what number it increases the guota.

On 28 October 2016, Carnival again applied to the Commission for an extension of the 2013 Exemption, on the same terms, for a further period of two and a half years.

The Commission notes that the 2013 Exemption expired on 15 May 2016, and further notes that an exemption has not been in place for the most recent 'Schoolies Period' being from 1 November 2016 to 31 January 2017. The Commission asked Carnival to provide a reason for why it did not apply for a further exemption prior to the expiration of the 2013 Exemption. Carnival responded that it did not apply for a further exemption prior to the expiration of the last exemption due to an oversight; however, as soon as it became aware of the error (i.e. in October 2016) it acted to submit an application for renewal of the exemption. Carnival also stated that based on general booking trends over previous 'Schoolies Periods', it expects that a significant number of booking for cruises which were schedule to depart and did depart from 1 November 2016 to 7 January 2017 would have been made prior to the expiry of the 2013 Exemption.

The Commission has decided to grant an exemption, for a period of one year from the date of this notice, subject to the terms and conditions set out below (2017 Exemption).

Background

Carnival relies on the same reasons for seeking this exemption as it relied on in its Initial Exemption application in April 2009 and in its 2013 Exemption application.

In support of the current application, Carnival has included data in accordance with the conditions attached to the grant of its 2013 Exemption and relevant to its implementation of the exemption.

Reasons for initial application

Carnival states that prior to lodging the Initial Exemption application it experienced a high level of alcohol-fuelled and other security incidents on-board its cruises in the traditional 'Schoolies Period', which it defines as 1 November to 31 January (Schoolies Period).

Up until 2006, Carnival operated 'Schoolies' cruises, which were marketed exclusively to passengers aged 16 to 19 years celebrating the end of their high school education. However, these 'Schoolies' cruises became problematic due to the large number of alcohol-related and other security incidents involving a large number of school-leavers (Schoolies). These incidents included serious risks to the health and safety of passengers, crew and the Schoolies participants themselves.

Carnival attempted to reduce the number and severity of these incidents by obtaining the advice of security experts and implementing a range of security measures, such as restricting access to alcohol, increasing security presence on-board its cruises and increasing pre-boarding / on-boarding searches for contraband alcohol. Despite these

various measures, Carnival advised that it continued to experience a large number of alcohol-fuelled incidents involving Schoolies.

Sometime in 2006, Carnival made a decision to discontinue promoting its cruises to school leavers. However, Carnival advised that even after this step was taken, there continued to be large numbers of school-leavers booking cruises and it continued to experience alcohol-fuelled and other 'Schoolies' incidents.

Reasons for further Application

Carnival advises that since the Commission granted the Initial Exemption and the 2013 Exemption, it has observed a significant and continued decrease in the number of alcohol related security incidents during the Schoolies Period. Carnival considers that this decrease is attributed to the Initial Exemption granted by the Commission in 2010 and the further 2013 Exemption granted by the Commission.

By way of an example, Carnival states that:

- in December 2005, it recorded 457 separate security incidents on one cruise-ship, during one cruise;
- in December 2012, it recorded a total of 67 security incidents, across its four cruise-ships and in all cruises for that month;
- In December 2014, it recorded a total of 18 security incidents across six Australian home-ported vessels and across all cruises on those vessels for that month; and
- In December 2015, it recorded a total of 5 security incidents across six Australian home-ported vessels and across all cruises for that month.

Carnival also states that during the period of the 2013 Exemption, it continued to observe a general decrease in the number of customer service complaints from passengers onboard cruises during Schoolies Periods in relation to excessive behaviour engaged in by passengers under the age of 19 years. Carnival also states that the Initial Exemption and the 2013 Exemption has served to:

- discourage Schoolies from making bookings for the purpose of engaging in improper behaviour and under-age drinking;
- reduce the likelihood of unmanageable large-scale 'Schoolies' events organised through means such as social networking; and
- promote an understanding that Carnival cruises will not tolerate improper behaviour and under-age drinking on its cruise-ships as part of the Schoolies Period celebrations.

In seeking the further exemption, Carnival emphasises the primacy of health, safety and security of its crew and passengers. It states that health and safety risks on its cruise-ships are compounded by the following factors:

 the on-board environment contains inherent risks, including risks associated with confined spaces and falling from heights or into the ocean;

- while at sea, its cruise-ships are isolated from emergency medical services and there are limited on-board medical facilities:
- while at sea, it cannot call upon an immediately available police presence;
- there are practical limitations to security personnel numbers which it can accommodate on its cruises;
- on-board security personnel are limited in terms of:
 - o their rights to detain, search and control passengers; and
 - the facilities available for detaining passengers who are a threat to themselves and/or others:
- past experience shows that Schoolies participants have a remarkable ingenuity for circumventing its procedures in relation to restricting access to and the consumption of alcohol; and
- past experience shows that Schoolies' celebrations involve large groups organised through school and social networking, and these groups seek to run events/gatherings on-board which are difficult to manage.

Data from the 2013 Exemption period

In support of its 2017 Exemption application, Carnival has provided relevant information for the period 2013 – 2016, in relation to the following matters:

- how many Carnival cruises departed from Australian ports in the Schoolies Period;
- how many young people (aged 16-18 years inclusive) were on-board each of the cruise-ships which departed in the Schoolies Period;
- how many young people, on the cruise-ships which departed in the Schoolies Period, were accompanied by an adult and how many were unaccompanied;
- incidents of anti-social behaviour on its cruise-ships during the Schoolies Period
- how many applications were received by Carnival for a waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement, and how frequently Carnival waived the Responsible Adult Requirement, in the period 1 November to 7 January; and
- how frequently Carnival increased the 60 passenger quota, applicable in the period 8 January to 31 January and on how many occasions and to what number Carnival increased the quota.

The Commission notes that in its 2013 Exemption application, Carnival provided information for the period 2010 – 2013 in relation to the same matters.

Submissions received by the Commission

Carnival's request for a further temporary exemption was posted on the Commission's website and interested parties were invited to comment on the Application. The Commission also circulated the Application to:

- 1. all State and Territory anti-discrimination bodies;
- 2. the New South Wales Police Marine Area Command; and
- 3. the Alcohol and Other Drugs Council of Australia.

The Commission received three submissions in response to the Application. These are available on the Commission's website.2

The Equal Opportunity Commission of South Australia advised that it had no objection to the Commission granting Carnival a further exemption. The Victorian Equal Opportunity and Human Rights Commission did not express a view on whether the Commission should grant the exemption. The Anti-Discrimination-Board of New South Wales (ADBNSW) made a submission, which did not support the grant of the exemption. The ADBNSW noted that it had also opposed the grant of the exemptions in Carnival's previous applications in 2010 and 2013, and that its position on the matter is essentially unchanged. The ADBNSW's view is that the exemption does not appear to give any benefit to the targeted age group, nor does it appear to reduce disadvantage to them and to that extent. it would appear to be inconsistent with the purposes of the ADA. The ADBNSW noted that. notwithstanding any grant of an exemption, should its President receive a complaint against Carnival that alleges a breach of the Anti-Discrimination Act 1977 (NSW) on the ground of age, the President would be obliged to investigate the alleged breach.

Relevant Law

The Commission may grant an exemption from the operation of a provision of Division 2 or 3 of Part 4 of the ADA. An exemption may be granted subject to terms and conditions specified in the instrument, and may be expressed to apply only in circumstances, or in relation to particular activities, as specified in the instrument.4 Exemptions are to be granted for a specified period not exceeding five years.⁵ It is not unlawful for a person to act in accordance with an exemption.6

Pursuant to section 28 of the ADA, it is unlawful to discriminate on the ground of age in the provision of goods, services or facilities. This provision is located in Division 3 of Part 4 of the ADA. Therefore, the Commission may grant Carnival an exemption from the operation of section 28 of the ADA.

Decision and Reasons

The Commission has decided to grant an exemption to Carnival from section 28 of the ADA on the terms set out below, in order to allow Carnival to implement its age restriction policy which has the aim of preventing 'Unauthorised Events' occurring on its cruise-ships.

Carnival's policy defines an 'Unauthorised Event' as any event which may be large in scale and which is associated with excessive or anti-social behaviour, including the abuse of alcohol (Unauthorised Event). Carnival's policy identifies a 'Schoolies Event' as an example of an Unauthorised Event. The Commission notes that the term 'Schoolies Event' generally refers to celebrations by young people who have just finished their last year of high school, or who are celebrating with other young people who have just finished their last year of high school.

Terms and conditions of the Exemption

Terms

Carnival may impose the following restrictions, based on age, in relation to its cruises commencing in Australia:

1. For Carnival cruise-ships departing an Australian port between 1 November 2017 and 7 January 2018, passengers who are under the age of 19 must be accompanied by a responsible adult (Responsible Adult Requirement).

Carnival may, at its sole and absolute discretion, waive the Responsible Adult Requirement where it is satisfied that a specific passenger under the age of 19 does not present a risk of participating in an Unauthorised Event.

Carnival may require any such passenger to sign a code of conduct or provide other commitments as a condition of boarding.

Where the Responsible Adult Requirement is mentioned in Carnival's advertising or online booking system, Carnival will state that it has retained a discretion to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement. Carnival will also state that queries/requests for review in relation to a waiver application decision can be made through its complaints handling process and will publish information about this process.

Carnival will assess each application for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement that it receives.

Carnival will adopt/amend its current complaints handling mechanism to allow applicants who are dissatisfied with Carnival's initial assessment on a waiver application to further engage with Carnival on the matter, and Carnival will participate in that process in good faith.

2. For Carnival cruise-ships departing an Australian port between 8 January 2018 and 31 January 2018, Carnival will permit a quota of 60 passengers per cruise who are under the age of 19 and not accompanied by a responsible adult. Once this quota is filled, Carnival will apply its Responsible Adult Requirement.

The quota will not include infants and will also not include passengers under the age of 17, where Carnival believes that the minor does not present a risk of

participating in an Unauthorised Event. Carnival will otherwise determine how the quota is filled.

Carnival may, in its sole and absolute discretion, increase this quota where it decides that the increase will not result in a risk to health, safety and security of the passengers and crew, having regard to the purpose of its policy.

Carnival will assess each application for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement (where the quota is filled and it becomes applicable).

Carnival will adopt/amend its current complaints handling mechanism to allow applicants who are dissatisfied with Carnival's initial assessment on a waiver application to further engage with Carnival on the matter, and Carnival will participate in that process in good faith.

Conditions

This exemption is subject to the following conditions:

Carnival will provide a comprehensive report to the Commission by no later than 30 March 2018, as to:

- 1. how many applications/requests for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement it receives for the 1 November 2017 to 7 January 2018 period and how many of these applications/requests it approves;
- 2. how many applications/requests it receives for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement during the 8 January 2018 to 31 January 2018 period, once the quota is filled;
- 3. on how many occasions and to what number it increased the quota;
- 4. how many applicants utilised Carnival's complaints handling process to engage with Carnival further on waiver application decisions;
- 5. any changes to the number or level of Unauthorised Events;
- 6. analysis and evidence that any reduction in Unauthorised Events are a direct result of the restrictions based on age;
- 7. whether, and why, the restrictions continue to be necessary to reduce Unauthorised Events:
- 8. any alternate methods/strategies to reduce Unauthorised Events that it has implemented or trialled; and
- 9. the success or otherwise of those methods/strategies.

Period of Exemption

The exemption is granted for one year from the date of this instrument.

Reasons for Decision

The reasons for the Commission's decision to grant the exemption are as follows.

Carnival's policy pursues a legitimate public policy goal and is appropriately targeted in its approach

The Commission accepts Carnival's health, safety and security concerns regarding Schoolies celebrations on its cruises, including:

- the risk of secondary supply of alcohol to passengers under the age of 18 and the
 difficulty of preventing this. Considering that the secondary supply of alcohol
 contravenes Carnival's RSA policies and obligations, and raises a significant risk to
 the health, safety and security of passengers, the Responsible Adult Requirement is
 an appropriate response to that concern;
- the ability of Schoolies to organise unmanageable large-scale events through means such as social networking;
- the limited capacity of on-board medical facilities in the event of accidents and the
 risks of accidents occurring (such as falling from heights on a cruise-ship or into the
 ocean). The Commission also notes the submission of ADCA that general risks
 associated with young people drinking are compounded by the dangers alcohol
 may pose in the potentially high-risk marine environment;
- the inability to call upon a police presence in the management of issues which may arise as a result of Unauthorised Events; and
- the limitations facing on-board security personnel in the management of issues which may arise as a result of Unauthorised Events.

The Commission considers that the parameters Carnival has set in relation to the Responsible Adult Requirement make it an appropriately targeted approach, in the short term. Specifically, the Commission has had regard to the Responsible Adult Requirement being:

1. Appropriately targeted in terms of age

The Responsible Adult Requirement is limited to passengers under the age of 19 years and, in respect of the restrictions in the period 8 January – 31 January, it does not include passengers under the age of 17 where Carnival believes that the minor does not present a risk of participating in an Unauthorised Event.

2. Appropriately targeted in terms of its periods of application

The Responsible Adult Requirement is applied more strictly in the period 1 November – 7 January, where passengers under the age of 19 are not able to travel unless accompanied by a responsible adult. This period closely resembles the traditional period for 'Schoolies' celebrations. The Commission notes that during the 2013 Exemption period, Carnival received 19 applications for wavier of the Responsible Adult Requirement of which 13 were approved and 6 were denied. The applications denied were based on Carnival's assessment of risk, and Carnival provides the example of cases where it was concerned about the risk of the

secondary supply of alcohol to minors were the bookings included 18 year old guests with 17 year old guests.

The Responsible Adult Requirement is applied less strictly in the period 8 January – 31 January, during which time Carnival applies the adjustable quota restriction. The Commission notes that during the Initial Exemption period, Carnival has on one occasion increased the quota of 60 to 68 and that it has not been necessary to consider increasing the quota on other occasions as Carnival has not had more than 60 passengers under the age of 19 seek to make bookings during the relevant period. During the 2013 Exemption period, it was not necessary for Carnival to consider increasing the quota as Carnival did not have more than 60 unaccompanied passengers under the age of 19 make bookings during that period.

3. Appropriately targeted in terms of its flexibility in application

Carnival's policy provides for a waiver (at its discretion) of the Responsible Adult Requirement. Carnival will state in its advertising and online booking system that it has retained this waiver discretion.

The Commission understands that Carnival's current practices is to consider exercising its discretion in relation to each application for a waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement that it receives. That is, Carnival does not assess each and every booking by a passenger under the age of 19, but will assess whether to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement for a booking when it is accompanied by an application for a waiver. Carnival has submitted that it is not in a position to assess every booking on a case by case basis, and this become difficult when Carnival's external agents do the booking. However, where a booking is accompanied by a request for a waiver and a passenger has made a request for an exception to the Responsible Adult Requirement policy, Carnival will assess each of those cases. This practice has been reflected in the terms of the exemption granted by this decision.

In the interest of providing the public with a greater level of information on the operation of the Responsible Adult Requirement, Carnival could provide more easily accessible information about how a potential passenger might submit an application for a waiver, and make Carnival's discretion to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement more transparent. For example, Carnival could do this by placing a clear link to a waiver application form on the bookings page of its website so as to allow potential passengers to more easily apply for a waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement.

The ability to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement recognises that there will be passengers under the age of 19 who do not present a risk of participating in an Unauthorised Event and thus should not be subject to the limitation.

4. Allows for a process of review

Under the terms of the exemption granted by this decision, Carnival will facilitate and engage in a review process that allows a potential passenger, who has applied to be exempt from the Responsible Adult Requirement policy, to further engage with Carnival if they are dissatisfied with Carnival's initial assessment of their waiver application.

Carnival will adopt/amend its current complaints handling mechanism to allow applicants who are dissatisfied with Carnival's initial assessment on a waiver application to further engage with Carnival on the matter, and Carnival will participate in that process in good faith.

In the interest of making this review mechanism transparent, Carnival will state in its advertising materials and online booking system, that queries or requests for review in relation to a waiver application decision can be made through its complaints handling process and will publish information that is easily and readily accessible about this process.

The Commission understands that Carnival has current complaint handling processes in place more generally, and that Carnival does not foresee any major difficulties in facilitating reviews and further engagement with passengers in relation to decisions concerning the waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement.

- 5. The terms of this exemption, that Carnival will state in its advertising and online booking system the existence of its discretion to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement, will further reduce the discriminatory impact of the exemption as young people will be aware of the flexible operation of Carnival's age restriction policy; and
- 6. The terms of this exemption, that:
 - a) Carnival will facilitate a process of review to allow potential passengers who are dissatisfied with an initial assessment on a waiver application to further engage with Carnival on the matter; and
 - b) Carnival will publish information about this process in its advertising and online booking system

will further reduce the discriminatory impact of the exemption as young people will be able to engage with Carnival, in good faith, which will promote a more transparent and flexible operation of Carnival's age restriction policy.

The period of exemption

The Commission notes that Carnival's Responsible Adult Requirement and Quota Restriction, have been in place since the grant of the Initial Exemption in 2010, and has captured six Schoolies Periods so far.

As outlined above, Carnival has provided convincing data showing that over the course of the Initial Exemption period and the 2013 Exemption period there has been a significant decrease in alcohol-fuelled and other security incidents on board Carnival cruises during the Schoolies Period. The Commission accepts that the Responsible Adult Requirement has had a significant impact on bringing about this result, and this may be particularly so in the early years of its operation.

However, there is no current data to show whether the restrictions allowed by the exemptions continue to be the only factor, or the predominant factor, in the decrease of security incidents on board the cruises operating in the Schoolies Periods. Especially in more recent years, there could feasibly be other factors contributing to the results provided by Carnival.

The Commission understands that Carnival has not thus far been required to test whether factors outside of the Responsible Adult Requirement and Quota Restriction have contributed to the decrease in alcohol-related security incidents.

The Commission notes that exemptions are commonly granted to allow time, where necessary, to make changes to comply with anti-discrimination legislation. As an exemption has been in place since 2010, the Commission has decided to limit the grant of the 2017 Exemption to a period of one year. This is to allow Carnival to consider whether there is an ongoing necessity for an exemption from section 28 of the ADA, and whether there are other means of achieving its purpose with a view to the longer term.

In light of the above and in the event that Carnival does wish to apply to the Commission for a further exemption upon the expiry of the 2017 Exemption, the Commission will require Carnival to provide a comprehensive report as to:

- 1. any changes to the number or level of Unauthorised Events;
- analysis and evidence that any reduction in Unauthorised Events are a result of the restrictions based on age;
- 3. whether, and why, the restrictions continue to be necessary to reduce Unauthorised Events;
- 4. any alternate methods/strategies to reduce Unauthorised Events that it has implemented or trialled; and
- 5. the success or otherwise of those methods/strategies.

Conclusion

The Commission concludes that Carnival's policy is a reasonable measure which should be permitted for a period of one year, having weighed up the nature and extent of the discriminatory effect against the reasons in favour of the exemption.

Application For Review

Subject to the *Administrative Appeals Tribunal Act 1975* (Cth), any person whose interests are affected by this decision may apply to the Administrative Appeals Tribunal for a review of the decision.

AUSTRALIAN HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION AGE DISCRIMINATION ACT 2004 (CTH), S 44(1) NOTICE OF GRANT OF A TEMPORARY EXEMPTION

By this instrument, under section 44(1) of the *Age Discrimination Act 2004* (Cth) (ADA), the Australian Human Rights Commission grants an exemption to Carnival plc, trading as Carnival Australia (Carnival), from the operation of section 28 of the ADA.

This exemption is granted for a period of three years from the date of this instrument and is subject to the conditions outlined below.

1 The Application

Carnival is a cruise company that operates cruises to the Pacific Islands from Australia and New Zealand.

On 7 April 2009, Carnival applied for an exemption under the ADA to implement a strategy for managing security issues, which were arising on its cruises in the period of 1 November to 31 January each year (Schoolies Period). The core aspects of this strategy, for which the exemption was sought, were, inter alia:

- 1. requiring that any passengers under the age of 19 years, travelling in the period 1 November to 7 January, be accompanied by a responsible adult (subject to waiver by Carnival) (The Responsible Adult Requirement)
- 2. restricting to 60 (subject to any increase at Carnival's discretion) the number of unsupervised passengers under the age of 19 years on-board any cruise in the period 8 January to 31 January (Quota Restriction).

Carnival submitted that its age restriction policy had the aim of preventing 'Unauthorised Events' occurring on its cruise-ships. Carnival's policy defines an 'Unauthorised Event' as any event which may be large in scale and which is associated with excessive or anti-social behaviour, including the abuse of alcohol (Unauthorised Event). Carnival's policy identifies a 'Schoolies Event' as an example of an Unauthorised Event. The Commission notes that the term 'Schoolies Event' generally refers to celebrations by young people who have just finished their last year of high school, or who are celebrating with other young people who have just finished their last year of high school (Schoolies Event). The term 'Schoolies' refers to a group of young people who have just finished high school and are typically 16 to 19 years of age (Schoolies).

On 23 December 2010, the Commission granted to Carnival an exemption for two and a half years (Initial Exemption).

On 21 June 2013, Carnival applied to the Commission for an extension of the Initial Exemption, on the same terms, for a further period of two and a half years. On 15 November 2013, the further exemption was granted (2013 Exemption).

On 28 October 2016, Carnival applied to the Commission for an extension of the 2013 Exemption, on the same terms, for a further period of two and a half years.

On 22 June 2017, an exemption was granted for a one year period on similar terms as the 2013 Exemption (2017 Exemption), with the additional requirements that:

Where the Responsible Adult Requirement is mentioned in Carnival's advertising or online booking system, Carnival will state that it has retained a discretion to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement. Carnival will also state that queries/requests for review in relation to a waiver application decision can be made through its complaints handling process and will publish information about this process. Carnival will assess each application for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement that it receives.

Carnival will adopt/amend its current complaints handling mechanism to allow applicants who are dissatisfied with Carnival's initial assessment on a waiver application to further engage with Carnival on the matter, and Carnival will participate in that process in good faith.

The 2017 Exemption was granted subject to the condition that Carnival would provide a report to the Commission as to the following:

- 1. how many applications/requests for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement it receives for the 1 November 2017 to 7 January 2018 period and how many of these applications/requests it approves
- 2. how many applications/requests it receives for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement during the 8 January 2018 to 31 January 2018 period, once the quota is filled
- 3. on how many occasions and to what number it increased the quota
- 4. how many applicants utilised Carnival's complaints handling process to engage with Carnival further on waiver application decisions
- 5. any changes to the number or level of Unauthorised Events
- 6. analysis and evidence that any reduction in Unauthorised Events are a direct result of the restrictions based on age

- 7. whether, and why, the restrictions continue to be necessary to reduce Unauthorised Events
- 8. any alternate methods/strategies to reduce Unauthorised Events that it has implemented or trialled
- 9. the success or otherwise of those methods/strategies.

On 20 June 2018, Carnival applied to the Commission for an extension of the 2017 Exemption, on substantially the same terms as the 2017 Exemption, for a further period of five years.

2 Decision of the Commission

After an extensive period of consultation with Carnival, the Commission has decided to grant an exemption for a period of three years from the date of this notice, subject to the terms and conditions set out below (2019 Exemption).

3 Considerations

In reaching its decision, the Commission considered the following:

- The application and submissions by Carnival dated 29 June 2018
- Carnival's report to the Commission, as required by the conditions of the 2017 Exemption, dated 29 March 2018
- Applications and submissions by Carnival in relation to previous exemption applications that Carnival stated it relied upon
- All information provided by Carnival in response to the Commission's requests for further information
- Submissions from other interested parties.

In reaching its decision, the Commission had regard to the following:

- The terms and objects of the ADA
- The Commission Guidelines: Exemption applications under the Age Discrimination Act 2004 (Cth).

4 Background

Carnival relies on substantially the same reasons for seeking this exemption as it relied on in its previous applications.

In support of the current application, Carnival has included data in accordance with the conditions attached to the grant of its 2017 Exemption and relevant to its implementation of the exemption. Carnival has also provided the Commission with additional information and data as requested by the Commission in its consultation with Carnival.

4.1 Reasons for initial application

Carnival states that prior to lodging the Initial Exemption application it experienced a high level of alcohol-fuelled and other security incidents on-board its cruises in the traditional Schoolies Period.

Up until 2006, Carnival operated Schoolies cruises, which were marketed exclusively to passengers aged 16 to 19 years celebrating the end of their high school education. However, these Schoolies cruises became problematic due to the large number of alcohol-related and other security incidents involving a large number of school-leavers. These incidents included serious risks to the health and safety of passengers, crew and the Schoolies participants themselves.

Carnival attempted to reduce the number and severity of these incidents by obtaining the advice of security experts and implementing a range of security measures, including the following:

- Increasing security presence on-board—including contracting 60 security personnel and two trained investigators across its cruise-ships
- Screening for and confiscation of alcohol at embarkation using screening devices (all guests screened)
- Drug screening on embarkation using screening devices and drug sniffer dogs (all guests screened)
- Increasing restrictions to the access and consumption of alcohol, including refusing to serve alcohol to persons involved in incidents, de-activating alcohol purchasing cards, providing unique wrist bands secured with metal clips to identify guests aged 18 years and over, and attempting to police the secondary supply of alcohol
- Tightening its policies and procedures in relation to the access and consumption of alcohol, including providing certain on-board bars

designated as alcohol free bars, and limiting guests to the purchase of a maximum of 2 drinks at any visit to the bar

 Enhancing the training and instruction of its crew in relation to the above procedures, including additional Responsible Service of Alcohol enforcement duties for all staff.

Despite these various measures, Carnival advised that it continued to experience a large number of alcohol-fuelled incidents involving Schoolies. Carnival advised that Schoolies participants continued to find methods of circumventing Carnival's security measures by either smuggling alcohol on board, obtaining alcohol through above-drinking age passengers or drinking to excess at ports before reboarding the ship. Carnival further advised that there were also incidents where Schoolies participants pre-arranged fights and rioting which had not necessarily been fuelled by alcohol.

In 2006, Carnival decided to discontinue promoting its cruises to school leavers. However, Carnival advised that even after this step was taken, there continued to be large numbers of school-leavers booking cruises and it continued to experience alcohol-fuelled and other Schoolies incidents.

4.2 Reasons for further applications

Carnival advises that since the Commission granted the Initial Exemption, it has observed a significant and continued decrease in the number of alcohol related security incidents during the Schoolies Period. Carnival considers that this decrease is attributed to the Initial Exemption granted by the Commission in 2010 and the further 2013 and 2017 Exemptions granted by the Commission.

By way of an example, Carnival states that:

- in December 2005, it recorded 457 separate security incidents on one cruise-ship, during one cruise
- in December 2012, it recorded a total of 67 security incidents, across its four cruise-ships and in all cruises for that month
- In December 2014, it recorded a total of 18 security incidents across six Australian home-ported vessels and across all cruises on those vessels for that month
- In December 2015, it recorded a total of five security incidents across six Australian home-ported vessels and across all cruises on those vessels for that month

• In December 2017, it recorded a total of 13 security incidents across seven Australian home-ported vessels and across all cruises on those vessels for that month.

Carnival also states that since the Initial Exemption, it continues to observe a general decrease in the number of customer service complaints from passengers' on-board cruises during Schoolies Periods in relation to excessive behaviour engaged in by passengers under the age of 19 years.

Carnival also states that the exemptions have served to:

- discourage Schoolies from making bookings for the purpose of engaging in improper behaviour and under-age drinking
- reduce the likelihood of unmanageable large-scale Schoolies events organised through means such as social networking
- promote an understanding that Carnival cruises will not tolerate improper behaviour and under-age drinking on its cruise-ships as part of the Schoolies Period celebrations.

In seeking this further exemption, Carnival emphasises the primacy of health, safety and security of its crew and passengers. It states that health and safety risks on its cruise-ships are compounded by the following factors which Carnival submit are as relevant today as they were at the time Carnival applied for its first exemption:

- the on-board environment contains inherent risks, including risks associated with confined spaces and falling from heights or into the ocean
- cruise-ships are unique environments where guests can move freely between venues on-board the ship, such as bars, restaurants, theatres, outside decks and their cabins. Guests can move around the ship with food and beverages, for example, a drink purchased at a bar could then be taken into a theatre to watch a show or consumed in a guest's cabin
- while at sea, its cruise-ships are isolated from emergency medical services and there are limited on-board medical facilities
- while at sea, it cannot call upon an immediately available police presence
- there are practical limitations to security personnel numbers which it can accommodate on its cruises, more specifically:
 - o there are limited staff cabins and staff facilities on-board
 - security personnel are required to complete highly specialised training in accordance with all relevant maritime laws, and Carnival

has a limited pool of security personnel available with the requisite training

- on-board staff must have the required visas, vaccinations and travel documentation available before joining a ship, and therefore it is difficult to increase staff members in emergency circumstances or with limited notice
- on-board security personnel are limited in terms of:
 - o their rights to detain, search and control passengers
 - the facilities available for detaining passengers who are a threat to themselves and/or others
- past experience shows that Schoolies participants have a remarkable ingenuity for circumventing its procedures in relation to restricting access to and the consumption of alcohol—Carnival states that contraband alcohol has been detected on-board in Listerine mouthwash bottles, shampoo bottles and in sealed soft drink cans
- the legal drinking age in many ports of call in the Pacific Islands is below 18 years of age, and minors may be legally permitted to purchase and consume alcohol while Carnival's ships are in port. Some ports of call have local traditions that involve consuming products containing narcotics, for example, drinking kava in Pacific Island nations. Carnival notes that it has no ability to control a guest's behaviour in port, and it also cannot refuse to allow a passenger to re-board its ship as disembarkation of a passenger can be complex where it involves repatriation
- past experience shows that Schoolies celebrations involve large groups organised through school and social networking, and these groups seek to run events/gatherings on-board which are difficult to manage.

4.3 Data from the 2017 Exemption period

Carnival's report to the Commission dated 29 March 2018 (provided pursuant to clause 5.1(b) of the 2017 Exemption Grant Notice) and Carnival's current exemption application, dated 29 June 2018, relevantly contained the following information:

 The 2017 Exemption required Carnival to create a complaint handling mechanism to allow applicants who were dissatisfied with Carnival's initial assessment on a waiver application, to further engage with Carnival on the matter. Carnival states that during the 1 November 2017 to 7 January 2018 period, it received 15 applications for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement, of which five were approved and ten were denied. The applications denied were based on Carnival's assessment of the risk, including where:

- a) 18 year old guests were travelling with 17 year old guests with the inherent risk of secondary supply of alcohol to minors; and
- b) more than one cabin of 18 year old guests requested to travel together.

Carnival had two applicants utilise the complaint handling process to engage with Carnival further on waiver application decisions. These two applicants were ultimately granted waiver approval and are part of the five applications which were approved in total. These two cases were escalated to Carnival's Head of Customer Service for further assessment, and where necessary, assurances from parents/legal guardians were sought prior to a waiver being approved.

- Carnival states that there were no requests for a waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement in the 8 January 2018 to 31 January 2018 period, as the quota of 60 unaccompanied passengers under the age of 19 was not reached for any of Carnival's cruises which departed during that period.
- Carnival states that there were some isolated security incidents involving guests aged 17 to 19 between 1 November 2017 and 31 January 2018, but Carnival does not consider these incidents to be attributed to large scale Unauthorised Events or excessive behaviour engaged in by groups.
- Carnival submits that the restrictions permitted under the 2017
 Exemption continue to be necessary due to its ongoing concern for the health, safety and security of its crew and passengers. Carnival emphasises that land-based Schoolies events have the benefit of substantial support from emergency services and government departments in preventing and responding to incidents. For example, the Gold Coast benefits from having Police, Ambulance, Fire and Rescue, SES, Queensland Health, the Education Department and local Councils involved. These support services are not available to cruise-ships.
- Carnival believes that the most responsible course of action is to try and manage the risk at the booking phase, rather than the point at which Unauthorised Events involving large groups occur on-board its ships, hence its view that there is a continued need for its Responsible Adult Requirement policy.

• Carnival submits that there continues to be a strong demand for Schoolies cruises, and cruises operating during the Schoolies Period (albeit not promoted as Schoolies Cruises) continue to be a popular option for school leavers when choosing a destination for their end of school celebrations. Carnival provided an online report dated 16 February 2018, of a third party travel supplier advertising and promoting a cruise operated by a major cruise line brand as a 'Schoolies Cruise'. Carnival asserts that this was done without the knowledge or authorisation of that cruise line brand. Carnival also provides evidence of that same third party supplier advertising Schoolies packages and deals for 2018 and 2019 on its website. Carnival provides these examples in support of its submission that cruises are still a popular option for school leavers. Carnival further submits that without an exemption, Carnival will have no control over the promotion by third parties (such as travel agents) of its cruises which operate during the Schoolies Period.

Carnival has also provided relevant information for each Schoolies period from 2010 to 2018 in relation to the following matters:

- how many Carnival cruises departed from Australian ports in the Schoolies Period
- how many young people (aged 16 to 18 years inclusive) were on-board each of the cruise-ships which departed in the Schoolies Period
- how many young people, on the cruise-ships which departed in the Schoolies Period, were accompanied by an adult and how many were unaccompanied
- incidents of anti-social behaviour on its cruise-ships during the Schoolies Period
- how many applications were received by Carnival for a waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement, and how frequently Carnival waived the Responsible Adult Requirement, in the period 1 November to 7 January
- how frequently Carnival increased the 60 passenger quota, applicable in the period 8 January to 31 January and on how many occasions and to what number Carnival increased the quota.

5 Submissions received by the Commission

Carnival's request for a further exemption was posted on the Commission's website and interested parties were invited to comment on the application. The Commission also circulated the application to:

- 1. all State and Territory anti-discrimination bodies
- 2. the New South Wales Police Marine Area Command
- 3. the Alcohol and Other Drugs Council of Australia.

The Commission received a response from the Victorian Equal Opportunity and Human Rights Commission (VEOHRC). The VEOHRC did not express a view in relation to Carnival's application for an exemption, however it noted that it would seek to write to Carnival to advise Carnival to seek an exemption through VEOHRC from relevant Victorian anti-discrimination legislation. No other submissions were received. The Anti-Discrimination Board of New South Wales (ADBNSW) did not make a submission in relation to Carnival's current application, however the Commission notes that the ADBNSW has, in relation to Carnival's previous applications in 2010, 2013 and 2017, expressed the view that it does not support the grant of the exemption. The ADBNSW's view has been that the exemption does not appear to give any benefit to the targeted age group, nor does it appear to reduce disadvantage to them and to that extent, it would appear to be inconsistent with the purposes of the ADA. The ADBNSW has previously noted that, notwithstanding any grant of an exemption, should its President receive a complaint against Carnival that alleges a breach of the Anti-Discrimination Act 1977 (NSW) on the ground of age, the President would be obliged to investigate the alleged breach.

6 Relevant law

The Commission may grant an exemption from the operation of a provision of Division 2 or 3 of Part 4 of the ADA.² An exemption may be granted subject to terms and conditions specified in the instrument, and may be expressed to apply only in circumstances, or in relation to particular activities, as specified in the instrument.³ Exemptions are to be granted for a specified period not exceeding

five years.⁴ It is not unlawful for a person to act in accordance with an exemption.⁵

Pursuant to section 28 of the ADA, it is unlawful to discriminate on the ground of age in the provision of goods, services or facilities. This provision is located in Division 3 of Part 4 of the ADA. Therefore, the Commission may grant Carnival an exemption from the operation of section 28 of the ADA.

7 Decision and reasons

The Commission has decided to grant an exemption to Carnival from section 28 of the ADA on the terms set out below, in order to allow Carnival to implement its age restriction policy which has the aim of preventing Unauthorised Events occurring on its cruise-ships.

7.1 Terms and conditions of the Exemption

(a) Terms

Carnival may impose the following restrictions, based on age, in relation to its cruises commencing in Australia:

- 1. For Carnival cruise-ships departing an Australian port between 1 November and 7 January, Carnival will permit a quota of 20 passengers per cruise who are under the age of 19 and not accompanied by a responsible adult. Once this quota is filled, Carnival will require passengers who are under the age of 19 to be accompanied by a responsible adult (Responsible Adult Requirement).
- 2. For Carnival cruise-ships departing an Australian port between 8 January and 31 January, Carnival will permit a quota of 60 passengers per cruise who are under the age of 19 and not accompanied by a responsible adult. Once this quota is filled, Carnival will apply its Responsible Adult Requirement.
- 3. The quotas, in 1 and 2 above, will not include infants and will also not include passengers under the age of 17 where Carnival considers that the minor does not present a risk of participating in an Unauthorised Event. Carnival will otherwise determine how the quota in each period is filled.

Carnival may, in its sole and absolute discretion, increase the quota in either or both periods, where it decides that the increase will not result in a risk to health, safety and security of the passengers and crew, having regard to the purpose of its policy.

Carnival may, at its sole and absolute discretion, waive the Responsible Adult Requirement where it is satisfied that a specific passenger under the age of 19 does not present a risk of participating in an Unauthorised Event. Carnival may require any such passenger to sign a code of conduct or provide other commitments as a condition of boarding.

Where the Responsible Adult Requirement is mentioned in Carnival's advertising or online booking system, Carnival will clearly state that it can decide to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement. Carnival will state that prospective passengers can apply to Carnival for a waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement and will provide information about how an application for a waiver can be lodged. Carnival will provide clear publicly available information regarding the factors it considers when making decisions about waiver applications. This information will be provided at the time of booking. Carnival will also state that requests for review in relation to a waiver application decision can be made through its complaint handling process and will publish information about this process.

Carnival will assess each application for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement that it receives (when the relevant quota is filled, and it becomes applicable).

Carnival will continue operating its complaint handling mechanism to allow applicants who are dissatisfied with Carnival's initial assessment on a waiver application to further engage with Carnival on the matter, and Carnival will participate in that process in good faith.

(b) Conditions

Carnival will provide a report to the Commission by no later than 1 June 2022, as to:

- 1. how many applications/requests for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement it receives for the 1 November to 7 January period in each year that this exemption operates, and how many of these applications/requests it approves
- how many applications/requests it receives for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement during the 8 January to 31 January

- period in each year that this exemption operates, and how many of these applications/requests it approves
- 3. on how many occasions and to what number it increased the quotas, and reasons for the exercise of this discretion
- 4. how many applicants utilised Carnival's complaints handling process each year to engage with Carnival further on waiver application decisions, and the outcomes of that process
- 5. any changes to the number or level of Unauthorised Events
- 6. the details of the publicly available information published by Carnival in relation to:
 - i. Carnival's discretion to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement, and information regarding how a prospective passenger can apply for a waiver
 - ii. factors Carnival considers when making decisions about waiver applications
 - iii. the process for requesting a review in relation to a waiver application decision
- 7. whether, and why, the restrictions continue to be necessary to reduce Unauthorised Events
- 8. any new methods/strategies to reduce Unauthorised Events that it has implemented or trialled over the course of this exemption period
- 9. the success or otherwise of those methods/strategies to meet its objectives.

(c) Period of Exemption

The exemption is granted for three years from the date of this instrument.

7.2 Reasons for decision

The reasons for the Commission's decision to grant the exemption are as follows.

(a) Carnival's policy pursues a legitimate public policy goal and is appropriately targeted in its approach

The Commission accepts Carnival's submissions in relation to the health, safety and security concerns that arise at Schoolies celebrations on its cruises, including:

- the risk of secondary supply of alcohol to passengers under the age of 18 and the difficulty of preventing this. The secondary supply of alcohol contravenes Carnival's Responsible Service of Alcohol policies and obligations, and raises a significant risk to the health, safety and security of passengers.
- the limited capacity of on-board medical facilities in the event of accidents and the risks of accidents occurring (such as falling from heights on a cruise ship or into the ocean)
- the inability to control passengers' behaviour while in port, and the complexities involved in refusing to allow a passenger to re-board a ship where repatriation is involved
- the inability to call upon a police presence in the management of issues which may arise as a result of Unauthorised Events
- the limitations facing on-board security personnel in the management of issues which may arise as a result of Unauthorised Events
- the ability of Schoolies to organise unmanageable large-scale events through means such as social networking.

The Commission notes that Carnival has had an exemption from section 28 of the ADA since 2010. During this period, Carnival has collected data relevant to its application. This data reveals that:

- the number of Unauthorised Events has significantly decreased during the time that an exemption has been in place
- in the 2017 Exemption period, Carnival received 15 applications requesting a waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement, and in the 2013 Exemption period, Carnival received 19 applications for wavier of the Responsible Adult Requirement
- the quota of 60 unaccompanied passengers was not reached on any cruises during the 2013 and 2017 Exemption periods—this quota was reached on only one occasion, in the Initial Exemption period.

In the circumstances, the Commission considered that it may be possible to narrow the scope of the exemption and still address Carnival's health, safety and security concerns.

The Commission consulted with Carnival to ensure the terms of any further exemption were appropriately targeted. This exemption is granted subject to terms that require a narrower operation of Carnival's age restriction policy, compared to previous years that an exemption has been in place. The principal change is that Carnival will permit a quota of 20 passengers per cruise, in the 1 November to 7 January period, who are under the age of 19 and not accompanied by a responsible adult. Once this quota is filled, Carnival will require passengers who are under the age of 19 to be accompanied by a responsible adult. In previous exemptions, the Responsible Adult Requirement has been applied throughout the 1 November to 7 January period without an adjustable quota—i.e. all passengers under the age of 19 years were restricted from travelling unless accompanied by a responsible adult.

The Commission considers that the parameters set in relation to the adjustable quotas and the Responsible Adult Requirement in this 2019 Exemption make it an appropriately targeted approach. Specifically, the Commission has had regard to Carnival's policy being:

1. Appropriately targeted in terms of age

The Responsible Adult Requirement is limited to passengers under the age of 19 years and it does not include passengers under the age of 17 where Carnival believes that the minor does not present a risk of participating in an Unauthorised Event.

2. Appropriately targeted in terms of its periods of application and method of application

The 1 November to 7 January period closely resembles the traditional period of Schoolies celebrations. Under this exemption, Carnival will apply an adjustable quota, to allow 20 guests under the age of 19 to travel without a responsible adult during this period.

Carnival submits that for the 2018–2019 Schoolies season (the last Schoolies period), the average number of unaccompanied passengers aged 17 to 19 years, who sailed between 1 November 2018 to 7 January 2019, was six. For the 2018–2019 Schoolies season, the average number of unaccompanied passengers aged 17 to 19 years, who sailed between 8 January to 31 January, was 21. The latter statistic suggests that Carnival can safely accommodate approximately 20 passengers aged 17 to 19 years and who are not accompanied by an adult. Therefore, in this exemption, the quota introduced for the 1 November to 7 January period has been set

at 20 passengers per cruise where travel is not restricted by the Responsible Adult Requirement. This should allow a greater number of passengers under the age of 19 to travel unaffected by the Responsible Adult Requirement in the 1 November to 7 January period, relative to previous years that an exemption has been in place.

The Responsible Adult Requirement is applied less strictly in the 8 January to 31 January period, during which time Carnival applies an adjustable quota to allow 60 guests under the age of 19 to travel without a responsible adult. The Commission notes that, since 2010, during the Initial Exemption period, Carnival has on one occasion increased the quota of 60 to 68 and that it has not been necessary to consider increasing the quota on other occasions as Carnival has not had more than 60 passengers under the age of 19 seek to make bookings during the 8 January to 31 January period. It appears that in practice, the restriction in the 8 January to 31 January period has little to no discriminatory impact. The restriction remains in place as a precautionary measure.

The 1 November to 7 January period is the peak Schoolies Period where most Schoolies celebrations take place. Carnival submits that it is appropriate for a stricter quota to be applied in this period. Carnival further states that it cannot usefully draw on its experience in the 8 January to 31 January period to assess potential risks because the number of unaccompanied 17 to 19 year old passengers have not frequently been in the range of 60, the current average being 21 unaccompanied passengers per cruise in this period.

The quota of 20 unaccompanied passengers under the age of 19 years in the 1 November to 7 January period appears to strike an appropriate balance that minimises the discriminatory impact of Carnival's age restriction policy, while accommodating Carnival's health, safety and security concerns.

3. Appropriately targeted in terms of its flexibility in application

Carnival's policy provides for a waiver (at its discretion) of the Responsible Adult Requirement. Carnival will state in its advertising and online booking system that it has retained this waiver discretion. Carnival will also state that prospective passengers can apply to Carnival for a waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement and will provide information about that process.

The Commission understands that Carnival's current practice is to consider exercising its discretion in relation to each application for a waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement that it receives. That is, Carnival does not assess each and every booking by a passenger under

the age of 19 but will assess whether to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement for a booking when it is accompanied by an application for a waiver. Carnival has submitted that it is not in a position to assess every booking on a case by case basis, and this becomes difficult when Carnival's external agents do the booking. However, where a booking is accompanied by a request for a waiver and a passenger has made a request for an exception to the Responsible Adult Requirement policy, Carnival will assess each of those cases. This practice has been reflected in the terms of the exemption granted by this decision.

As noted above, during the 2013 Exemption period, Carnival received 19 applications for wavier of the Responsible Adult Requirement of which 13 were approved and six were denied. In the 2017 Exemption period, Carnival received 15 waiver applications, of which five were approved and ten were denied. The applications denied were based on Carnival's assessment of risk, and Carnival provides the example of cases where it was concerned about the risk of the secondary supply of alcohol to minors where the bookings included 18 year old guests with 17 year old guests.

The ability to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement recognises that there will be passengers under the age of 19 who do not present a risk of participating in an Unauthorised Event and thus should not be subject to the limitation.

4. Allows for a process of review

Under the terms of the exemption granted by this decision, Carnival will facilitate and engage in a review process that allows a potential passenger, who has applied to be exempt from the Responsible Adult Requirement policy, to further engage with Carnival if they are dissatisfied with Carnival's initial assessment of their waiver application.

The 2017 Exemption required Carnival to adapt its existing complaints handling mechanism to allow applicants who were dissatisfied with Carnival's initial assessment on a waiver application to further engage with Carnival on the matter. In the 2017 Exemption period, two applicants utilised the complaints handling process to engage with Carnival further on waiver application decisions. These two applicants were ultimately granted waiver approval. These two cases were escalated to Carnival's Head of Customer Service for further assessment, and where necessary, assurances from parents/legal guardians were sought prior to a waiver being approved. It appears that Carnival participated in that review process in good faith.

5. Allows for greater transparency

In the interest of providing the public with a greater level of information on the operation of the Responsible Adult Requirement, Carnival will state in its advertising and online booking system that it can waive the Responsible Adult Requirement. Carnival will also state that prospective passengers can apply for a waiver and will provide information about that process.

The terms of this exemption also require Carnival to provide clear publicly available information regarding the factors it considers when making decisions about waiver applications. This will allow for a greater level of transparency around Carnival's decision making considerations.

This information is to be collectively provided at the time of booking.

As in the 2017 Exemption, in the interest of making Carnival's review mechanism transparent and accessible, Carnival will state in its advertising materials and online booking system, that queries or requests for review in relation to a waiver application decision can be made through its complaints handling process and will publish information that is easily and readily accessible about this process.

(b) Carnival's policy is a reasonable measure having regard to the objects of the ADA

In making a determination on a temporary exemption application under the ADA, the Commission has regard to the objects of the ADA. The objects of the ADA include seeking to eliminate, as far as possible, discrimination against persons on the ground of age in a range of areas, including provision of goods, services or facilities.

The Commission recognises that Carnival's policy allows conduct which is inconsistent with the objects of the ADA. While this is a factor weighing against the grant of the exemption sought,⁶ it does not mean that the Commission cannot grant the exemption. In line with the Commission's Guidelines on the granting of a temporary exemption under the ADA, the Commission has assessed:

 the reasonableness of Carnival's policy, weighing up the nature and extent of the discriminatory effect against the reasons advanced in favour of the exemption

2. whether the exemption could be granted subject to terms and conditions which further the objects of the ADA.

In undertaking this assessment, the Commission has considered the following:

- 1. Carnival's concerns about controlling the consumption of alcohol on-board its cruises and its previous difficulties in managing the health, safety and security issues associated with Schoolies celebrations.
- 2. Carnival's submissions regarding the effectiveness of the Initial Exemption, 2013 Exemption and 2017 Exemption in reducing security incidents onboard its cruises.
- 3. Carnival has minimised the discriminatory impact of its policy by making it appropriately targeted in its application (noting the parameters of the Responsible Adult Requirement, and the introduction of an adjustable quota in the 1 November to 7 January period such that there is no discrimination against 20 passengers under the age of 19 years on any cruise in the relevant period, discussed above).
- 4. Carnival's application of the Responsible Adult Requirement during the Initial Exemption, 2013 Exemption, and 2017 Exemption periods show that Carnival has:
 - a) in relation to the 1 November to 7 January period, exercised its discretion to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement for people under the age of 19
 - b) in relation to the 8 January to 31 January period, increased the quota in one case.

This indicates that Carnival has, at least in some cases, accommodated the individual circumstances of particular young people and this contributes to the reasonableness of the policy.

- 5. The terms of this exemption, that:
 - a) Carnival will state in its advertising and online booking system that it can decide to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement, and that prospective passengers can apply for a waiver
 - b) Carnival will provide information regarding the factors it considers when making decisions about waiver applications

will further reduce the discriminatory impact of the exemption as young people will be aware of the flexible operation of Carnival's age restriction policy and will be aware that they can apply to be exempt from the operation of the policy.

6. The terms of this exemption, that:

- a) Carnival will facilitate a process of review to allow potential passengers who are dissatisfied with an initial assessment on a waiver application to further engage with Carnival on the matter
- b) Carnival will publish information about this process in its advertising and online booking system

will further reduce the discriminatory impact of the exemption as young people will be able to engage with Carnival, in good faith, which will promote a more transparent and flexible operation of Carnival's age restriction policy.

(c) The period of exemption

The Commission notes that Carnival has had an age restriction policy in place since the grant of the Initial Exemption in 2010.

As outlined above, Carnival has provided persuasive data showing that over the course of the Initial Exemption, 2013 Exemption and 2017 Exemption periods there has been a significant decrease in alcohol-fuelled and other security incidents on board Carnival cruises during the Schoolies Period. The Commission accepts that the Responsible Adult Requirement has had a significant impact on bringing about this result, and this may be particularly so in the early years of its operation.

The Commission notes that there is no current data to show whether the restrictions allowed by the exemptions continue to be the only factor, or the predominant factor, in the decrease of security incidents on board the cruises operating in the Schoolies Periods. There could feasibly be other factors contributing to the results provided by Carnival. The Commission understands that it is difficult, in practice, for Carnival to test whether factors outside of the Responsible Adult Requirement and quota restrictions have contributed to the decrease in alcohol-related security incidents.

Relative to previous exemptions granted, this exemption is granted subject to terms and conditions that require a narrower operation of Carnival's age restriction policy during the 1 November to 7 January period, with a view towards further minimising its discriminatory impact. This exemption is granted for a period of three years. The Commission requires Carnival, over the course of this exemption period, to consider whether there is an ongoing need for an

exemption from section 28 of the ADA, and whether there are other means of achieving its purpose at the conclusion of this exemption period.

(d) Conclusion

The Commission concludes that Carnival's policy is a reasonable measure which should be permitted for a period of three years, having weighed up the nature and extent of the discriminatory effect against the reasons in favour of the exemption.

8 Application for review

Subject to the *Administrative Appeals Tribunal Act 1975* (Cth), any person whose interests are affected by this decision may apply to the Administrative Appeals Tribunal for a review of the decision.

Application by Carnival Australia for Exemption under section 44(1) of the Age Discrimination Act 2004 (Cth)

We act for Carnival plc trading as Carnival Australia (Carnival Australia).

Our client seeks an exemption from the operation of the Age Discrimination Act 2004 (Cth) (the Act) pursuant to section 44(1) of the Act.

In seeking an exemption, our client does not admit that the Act applies to its operations, to the extent that these operations are conducted on cruise ships which are not within the jurisdiction of the laws of the Commonwealth of Australia. Our client reserves all of its rights in this respect.

Background

Carnival Australia is Australia's leading cruise company and operator of 12 cruise brands (including P&O Cruises Australia).

Carnival Australia is committed to the safety and comfort of its passengers and acknowledges the changing community standards in respect of youth alcohol consumption. As an integral part of this commitment, Carnival Australia discontinued its promotion and operation of dedicated "Schoolies" cruises after 2006.

The reason for this decision was that our client experienced an exponential increase in the amount of alcohol-related security incidents during "Schoolies" cruises. Carnival Australia did undertake valid measures to reduce such incidents. Those measures included refusing alcohol service to persons involved in incidents, de-activating alcohol purchasing cards, and increasing the presence of onboard security. Despite these measures, Carnival Australia continued to experience a high level of Schoolies incidents which were fuelled by alcohol and threatened the security, comfort and health and safety of its passengers. These risks were compounded by Schoolies bringing contraband alcohol on board cruises, and the fact that cruises are contained environments that are

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isolated from emergency services during periods at sea. Consequently, our client made an informed decision to discontinue promoting and operating these voyages.

Even though Carnival discontinued marketing targeted towards school leavers for cruises during the relevant "Schoolies" period, there continued to be high levels of school-leavers seeking to book cruises during the traditional "Schoolies" periods and Carnival continued to experience alcohol-fuelled incidents.

Carnival Australia wishes to restrict the ability of persons aged under 21 years of age to take part in cruises without a parent or guardian during the traditional "Schoolies" period of 1 November to 30 January (Schoolies Period). Our client seeks an exemption, as set out in the remainder of this letter to ensure that it does not contravene relevant age discrimination legislation by imposing this restriction.

Attached to this letter is a policy document setting out in greater detail as to the basis for our client's desire to restrict cruises during Schoolies periods, and relevant social research and data. We also attach a letter in support of our client's application from the Alcohol and other Drugs of Australia Council dated 23 December 2008.

Key Criteria for Assessment of Application

Guidelines

We refer to the Guidelines for applications for exemptions under section 44 of the Act which are published by the Commission. We address the criteria referred to in the Guidelines below.

We note that the Guidelines suggest that applications for exemptions are to allow organisations time to make changes to comply with the Act. However, we find no such limitation on the Commission's general powers to grant exemptions under section 44 of the Act.

We note that in other jurisdictions similar exemptions have previously been granted for reasons other than to allow for compliance.

1. Is an exemption necessary?

As set out above, our client does not, in making this application, admit that the Act applies to its activities in relation to leisure cruises upon vessels that are not "flagged" in the Australian jurisdiction. However, to the extent that the Commission is of the opinion that the Act does apply, it is possible that by putting in place a condition or requirement related directly to chronological age, may amount to unlawful discrimination under sections 14 and/or 15 and 28(b) of the Act.

The exemptions in sections 33, 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 40, 41, 41A, 42, and 43 of the Act do not appear to apply to the conditions that our client proposes to impose on persons during the Schoolies Period.

The exemption contained in section 39 extends to acts done in compliance with certain applicable Commonwealth, State and Territory acts and regulations. One of the main reasons for our client's seeking to implement the restrictions we have outlined above is a concern for the health, safety and well-being of all passengers and staff on its vessels.

Because our client's vessels do not carry Australian flags, pursuant to maritime laws these vessels are not subject to Commonwealth, State and Territory acts and regulations with regards to occupational health and safety. However, our client is under similar obligations with respect to health and safety under laws in the jurisdictions of the flags that its ships carry.

2. Is granting an exemption consistent with the objectives of the Act?

The objects of the Act are set out in section 3 to the Act. These explicit objectives are directed towards eliminating discrimination, ensuring equality, allowing appropriate benefits, to promote community recognition, and to remove negative stereotypes.

Our client's application for an exemption is motivated principally by concerns for the health and safety of its passengers, and a concern that it does not promote or condone cultural rights of passage amongst young Australians which involve drinking to dangerous levels and substance abuse. However, our client's concerns are not inconsistent with the objectives of the Act for the following reasons:

- Our client is not seeking to remove the ability of "under 21s" to enjoy cruises during the Schoolies period. Rather, it wishes to ensure that persons are accompanied by responsible persons who are likely to monitor the behaviour of persons under 21 years of age and reduce the likelihood of the types of unacceptable behaviour associated with the rite of passage known as Schoolies Week.
- Our client is not relying upon negative stereotypes about persons of a similar age
 to school leavers in making this application. Rather it is relying upon its own
 experience of incidents during the Schoolies Period, and upon social research
 and statistical data. This is set out in the attached policy document.

Further, as noted above, our client is under certain statutory obligations in other jurisdictions regarding the health and safety of its passengers and employees. Section 39 of the Act exempts conduct in compliance with other legislation. To the extent that our client's proposed conduct does not fall within the exemption in section 39, the exemption sought is similar to the exemption contemplated in section 39.

3. Is it appropriate to grant the exemption?

Our client respectfully submits that it is appropriate, on public policy grounds, to grant the exemption sought. As set out above, our client seeks an exemption for the purpose of ensuring the security and safety of its passengers and also because it does not wish to provide a forum for a rite of passage that is endemically associated with alcohol and substance abuse.

Our client believes that its concern is consistent with current public sector initiatives regarding alcohol and substance abuse amongst young adults.

We also note that a number of other hospitality providers in popular Schoolies locations already impose conditions on school leavers during the Schoolies period such as increased room and property bonds, and parent or guardian supervision for under 21 year

olds. Some properties simply do not allow persons under the age of 21 to book hotel rooms during the Schoolies Period.

4. Opinions of interested parties

As set out above, we attach a letter from David Templeman of the Alcohol and other Drugs Council of Australia in which Mr Templeman supports Carnival's application.

We also note that our client's application is consistent with recent government spending to address dangerous drinking behaviours amongst young adults.

We thank you for considering our client's application. Our client would be happy to provide any further information that may assist its application upon the Commission's request.

Application by Carnival for Further Exemption under Section 44(2) of the Age Discrimination Act 2004 (Cth) ("the Act")

We act for Carnival plc trading as Carnival Australia (Carnival), and refer to Carnival's previous application to the Commission for an exemption under section 44(1) of the Act (Exemption). This Exemption was granted by the Commission on 21 December 2010. The Exemption commenced on 23 December 2010 for a period of 2.5 years. The Exemption is due to expire on 22 June 2013 (Expiry Date).

Our client now seeks a further exemption under section 44(2) of the Act for an additional period of 2.5 years and on the same terms and conditions as the current Exemption (Further Exemption).

In seeking the Further Exemption, Carnival does not admit that the Act applies to its operations, to the extent that these operations are conducted on cruise ships which are not within the jurisdiction of the laws of the Commonwealth of Australia. Carnival reserves all of its rights in this respect.

Background

Reasons for Original Application for Exemption

Carnival is Australia's leading cruise company and represents 7 cruise brands (including P&O Cruises Australia) in the Australian and New Zealand markets.

Prior to obtaining the Exemption, Carnival was experiencing a significant increase in the amount of alcohol-related security incidents involving large numbers of "Schoolies" on its cruises during the traditional Schoolies period of 1 November to 31 January (Schoolies Period). These incidents involved serious risks to the health and safety of passengers, crew, and also the Schoolies participants themselves.

Carnival attempted to reduce the number and severity of these incidents by obtaining advice from security experts and implementing stringent security measures. These included:

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- * increasing restrictions to the access and consumption of alcohol (including refusing to serve alcohol to persons involved in incidents, de-activating alcohol purchasing cards, providing unique wrist bands to passengers who were above-drinking age, and attempting to police the secondary supply of alcohol).
- * tightening its policies and procedures in relation to the access and consumption of alcohol;
- * enhancing the training and instruction of its crew in relation to the above procedures;
- * increasing its pre-boarding and on-boarding searches for contraband alcohol; and
- * increasing its security numbers and presence.

Despite these measures, Carnival continued to experience a high level of Schoolies alcohol-fuelled incidents. In particular, Schoolies participants continued to find methods of circumventing Carnival's security measures by either smuggling alcohol on board, obtaining alcohol through above-drinking age passengers or drinking to excess before boarding the ship. There were also incidents where Schoolies' participants pre-arranged fights and rioting which had not necessarily been fuelled by alcohol.

These incidents continued even after Carnival made an informed decision to discontinue promoting and operating summer voyages to school-leavers during the Schoolies Period. After 2006, there continued to be high levels of school leavers seeking to book cruises and Carnival continued to experience alcohol-fuelled and other "Schoolies" incidents. Schoolies participants would organise their own large-scale events on Carnival ships through viral emails and messaging.

As a result of the above, Carnival sought an Exemption from the from the Commission on 7 April 2009 in order to restrict the ability of persons aged under 21 years of age to take part in cruises without a parent or guardian during the Schoolies period of 1 November to 31 January (Schoolies Period).

Following significant compromise from Carnival, the Commission granted the Exemption on 21 December 2010 which permitted Carnival to lawfully restrict the ability of persons aged under 19 years of age to take part in cruises without a responsible adult during Schoolies Periods. The reduction in the age limit of Carnival's Exemption to persons aged under 19 years was considered to be appropriate by the Commission in the circumstances and Carnival relies on the reasons published by the Commission as part of its decision of 21 December 2010.

Reasons for Application for Further Exemption

Since the Commission granted the Exemption, Carnival has observed a significant decrease in the number of alcohol-related security incidents during the Schoolies Period.

Carnival is of the view that such a decrease is attributable to the Exemption granted by the Commission in 2010.

For example, on a cruise in December 2005, Carnival recorded 457 separate security incidents on one vessel, during one cruise. In December 2012, across all four Carnival vessels and across all cruises for that month, a total of 67 security incidents were recorded. Carnival has also observed a general decrease in the number of customer service complaints from passengers onboard cruises during Schoolies Periods in relation to excessive behaviour engaged in by passengers aged under 19 years.

Carnival believes that the Exemption has served to:

- discourage Schoolies' participants from making bookings for the purpose of engaging in improper behaviour and under-age drinking; and
- (b) reduced the likelihood of unmanageable large-scale Schoolies events organised through, for example, social networking; and
- (c) promoted an understanding that Carnival cruises will not tolerate improper behaviour and under-age drinking on its cruise-ships as part of Schoolies celebrations;

Carnival also believes that the presence of a responsible adult acting as an authority figure for persons under the age of 19 during the Schoolies Period has served as an effective control mechanism to minimise incidents of underage drinking and other inappropriate behaviour.

Carnival wishes to continue to prioritise the health, safety and security of its passengers generally, and in particular during the Schoolies Period.

As Schoolies celebrations occur every year during the Schoolies Period, Carnival now seeks a Further Exemption in order to continue to lawfully restrict the ability of persons aged under 19 years of age to take part in cruises without a parent or guardian during the Schoolies Period.

In seeking the Further Exemption, Carnival again wishes to emphasise the primacy of the health and safety of its crew and passengers. These health and safety risks are compounded by the following factors:

- the onboard environment contains inherent and risks including, risks associated with confined spaces and falling from heights or into the ocean;
- (b) whilst at sea, Carnival ships are isolated from emergency medical services and there are limited onboard medical facilities;
- (c) whilst at sea, Carnival cannot call upon an immediately available police presence;
- (d) there are practical limitations to security personnel numbers which Carnival can accommodate on its cruises;
- (e) on-board security personnel have limited rights to detain, search and control in terms of managing violent and improper behaviour, and there are limited

facilities in terms of detaining passengers who are a threat to themselves and others;

- (f) from past experience, Schoolies participants have shown a remarkable ingenuity to circumvent procedures implemented by Carnival to restrict access to and the consumption of alcohol;
- (g) from past experience, Schoolies' celebrations have involved large groups organised through school or social networking, who then seek to run events/gatherings on board that are difficult to manage.

Carnival notes that the Commission, in publishing its Notice to Grant a Temporary Exemption to Carnival on 12 January 2011 (which we enclose for your convenience) (Notice), has also provided reasons as to why it was appropriate to grant Carnival an Exemption. Carnival seeks to rely on these reasons in this application for a Further Exemption. The foundations for the Exemption have not changed.

Key Criteria for Assessment of Application

Guidelines

We refer to the Guidelines for applications for exemptions under section 44 of the Act which are published by the Commission. We note that these Guidelines stipulate a number of criteria to be addressed in applications for exemptions under section 44 of the Act.

Carnival has previously addressed a number of these criteria in its previous application for an exemption dated 7 April 2009 (**Previous Application**). Carnival relies on the submissions and evidence which it made in relation to the Previous Application. A copy of the Previous Application is **enclosed** for your convenience.

1. What circumstances or activities are to be covered by the exemption?

In effect, Carnival seeks an extension of the Exemption, on the same terms. We repeat that these terms represented a significant compromise for Carnival, and Carnival believes that the Exemption strikes an appropriate and reasonable balance between genuine health and safety concerns, and the rights of persons aged under 19 years of age.

Carnival seeks to restrict the ability of persons aged under 19 years of age to take part in Carnival cruises in the absence of a responsible adult during a limited period generally associated with Schoolies' celebrations. For part of this period, Carnival will permit a quota of 60 passengers per cruise under the age of 19 and not accompanied by a responsible adult.

Such a restriction will enable Carnival to control the size of events which are commonly associated with school leavers during the Schoolies Period, and increase its ability to manage these events (including alcohol consumption at these events) without a risk to health and safety.

Carnival wishes to have the following matters covered in the exemption

- 1. Carnival will implement a policy which seeks to prevent events which may be large in scale and are associated with excessive and / or anti-social behaviour, including the abuse of alcohol (Unauthorised Events). Schoolies celebrations are an example of such events.
- 2. Carnival wishes to impose the following restrictions based on age on its cruises commencing in Australia:
 - (a) For Carnival cruise ships departing an Australian port between 1
 November and 7 January annually, passengers under the age of 19
 must be accompanied by a responsible adult (Responsible Adult
 Requirement); and
 - (b) For Carnival cruise ships departing an Australian port between 8
 January and 31 January annually, Carnival will permit a quota of 60
 passengers per cruise who are aged under 19 years to take part in the
 cruise without being accompanied by a responsible adult. This quota
 will not include infants and may not, where Carnival believes there is
 no risk of participation in an Unauthorised Event, include passengers
 under the age of 17. Beyond the 60 passenger quota, Carnival will
 require persons under the age of 19 years to be accompanied by a
 responsible adult.

This particular restriction may be waived by Carnival in its absolute discretion and where Carnival is satisfied that there is no risk that a particular passenger aged under 19 years will take part in an event which threatens the security, health and safety of other passengers and the cruise generally.

3. Where Carnival forms the view, based on reasonable grounds, that a passenger is planning to participate in an Unauthorised Event, Carnival may refuse boarding to that passenger or otherwise impose other conditions aimed at eliminating or reducing any risk to the health, safety and security of passengers and crew on board a particular Carnival cruise. This particular activity applies regardless of age to Carnival cruises which depart at any time during the year.

2. Who will be affected by the application?

Generally, this Further Exemption will affect persons aged between 17 and 19 years who may wish to take part in Carnival cruises during the Schoolies Period in connection with celebrations as a result of their completion of school. However, this impact will only be for a limited period of time, and these persons will not necessarily be prevented from enjoying a cruise during this period. For the first period of approximately two months, this age group can still travel with Carnival provided that they are accompanied by an adult. In the second period of approximately one month, an adult may not be required where Carnival has not filled its quota of 60 persons.

Persons of any age may also be affected by the restriction where Carnival forms the view that they plan to participate in an Unauthorised Event.

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3. Is an exemption necessary?

As set out above, Carnival does not, in making this Application, admit that the Act applies to its activities in relation to leisure cruises upon vessels that are not "flagged" in the Australian jurisdiction. However, to the extent that the Commission is of the opinion that the Act does apply, it is possible that by continuing to observe a condition or requirement directly related to chronological age, may amount to unlawful discrimination under section 14 and/or 15 and 28(b) of the Act.

The exemptions in section 33-38, 40-41, 41A and 42-43 of the Act do not appear to apply to the conditions that Carnival continues to impose on persons during the Schoolies Period.

The exemption contained in section 39 of the Act extends to acts done in compliance with certain applicable Commonwealth, State and Territory acts and regulations.

As stated earlier in this Application, the principal reason why Carnival is seeking an extension of the Exemption is an ongoing concern for the health, safety and wellbeing of all passengers and staff on its vessels.

Carnival is of the view that a Further Exemption is necessary to enable Carnival to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the health, safety and security of its passengers during Schoolies Periods. As indicated earlier in this Application, Carnival has previously attempted to reduce the risks associated with Unauthorised Events by significantly enhancing security and alcohol control measures. However, these have not been successful for the reasons previously outlined in this Application.

4. Why should an exemption be granted?

We have addressed these reasons earlier in this Application.

We repeat that Carnival's application for a Further Exemption is motivated principally by concerns for the health, safety and security of its passengers and crew. In its past experience, Schoolies events have involved anti-social behaviour, abusive behaviour (including sexual and racial abuse), sexual harassment, dangerous skylarking, property damage, violence, fighting, drinking to excess, and substance abuse. This behaviour was often directed at other passengers and crew who were not participating in Schoolies events.

Carnival notes that it has observed a general decrease in the number of Unauthorised Events and reported incidents involving anti-social behaviour during Schoolies Periods since the Commission granted an Exemption to Carnival in 2010.

As such, in seeking a Further Exemption, Carnival is not relying on negative stereotypes of school leavers and persons aged under 19 years. Rather, Carnival is relying on its own direct experiences of incidents during the Schoolies Period, and the comparison of the number of incidents after the Commission granted an Exemption in 2010. Carnival believes that, in order to continue to observe a general decrease in Unauthorised Events and reported incidents during Schoolies Periods, a Further Exemption is necessary.

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Carnival notes that, in seeking a Further Exemption and in continuing to lawfully undertake the activities described in section 1 above, such actions are not inconsistent with the objectives of the Act. Carnival is not seeking to remove the ability of persons aged under 19 years to enjoy cruises during Schoolies Periods. Rather, Carnival wishes to ensure that such persons are appropriately supervised in order to reduce the likelihood of the types of unacceptable behaviour associated with Schoolies vacations.

Carnival also respectfully submits that a Further Exemption should be granted as it is appropriate on the grounds of public policy. As set out above, Carnival seeks a Further Exemption for the purpose of continuing to ensure the health, safety and security of its passengers during Schoolies periods, and also because Carnival does not wish to provide a forum for a rite of passage that is endemically associated with alcohol, anti-social behaviour and substance abuse.

Carnival also notes that a number of other hospitality providers in popular Schoolies locations continue to impose conditions on school leavers during Schoolies Periods. Such conditions include increased room and property bonds, and a requirement for a parent or guardian to supervise persons under the age of 21 years. Further, Carnival notes that some properties simply refuse persons under the age of 21 to book hotel rooms during Schoolies periods.

Finally, Carnival refers to the Notice in which the Commission provided its reasons for granting Carnival's initial Exemption. Carnival notes that the Commission has stated the following in the Notice:

- The secondary supply of alcohol, in contravention of Carnival's Responsible Service of Alcohol policies and obligations, raises a significant risk to the health, safety and security of passengers and the Responsible Adult Requirement is an appropriate response to that concern.
- Although the Commission was of the view that Carnival's policy to be
 encompassed by the Exemption allowed conduct which was allegedly
 inconsistent with the objects of the Act, this was not of itself a reason for the
 Commission to deny the application for an Exemption. Accordingly, the
 Commission considered the reasonableness of Carnival's policy, weighing up
 the nature and extent of the discriminatory effect against the reasons
 advanced in favour of the Exemption.
- In taking into account a number of factors, including Carnival's legitimate
 concerns about controlling the consumption of alcohol on board its cruises,
 Carnival's policy encompassed by the Exemption was a reasonable measure
 which should be permitted.
- Carnival sought to minimise as far as possible the discriminatory effect of its
 policy encompassed by the Exemption by reducing both the age range and the
 time period of the Responsible Adult Requirement and by making it subject
 to exceptions in appropriate cases.

The above reasons put forward by the Commission in the Notice are relevant to the present application for a Further Exemption. That is, the circumstances surrounding Carnival's Further Exemption are the same as those relating to the initial Exemption application, which was granted by the Commission. As such, Carnival submits that such reasons should be considered by the Commission now in determining whether to grant Carnival a Further Exemption.

5. Are there factors that may affect the processing of the application?

In previous correspondence from the Commission dated 21 December 2010, we note that the Commission foreshadowed that Carnival should provide certain additional information in an application for a Further Exemption.

In particular, the Commission sought the information in response to a number of questions. These questions, together with Carnival's responses are as follows:

(c) How many Carnival Australia cruise ships departed from an Australian port, and what was the date of their departure and the identifying ship number for each vessel?

Please refer to the table at Schedule A.

(d) How many young people (aged 16-18 years old, inclusive) were on board each cruise ship? Please provide a breakdown of these passenger numbers on the basis of the age of the passenger.

Please refer to the table at Schedule A.

(e) How many young people were accompanied by an adult, and how many were unaccompanied?

Please refer to the table at Schedule B.

(f) In respect of each cruise, were there any recorded incidents of inappropriate or anti-social behaviour? Please provide details of the nature and seriousness of the incident and the age of the passengers involved in the incident.

Carnival keeps comprehensive and detailed records of every security incident which occurs on its vessels. Those records contain personal and potentially sensitive information which is highly confidential and occasionally the subject of police investigation.

Without disclosing potentially sensitive details in relation to individual incidents, Carnival notes that it has observed a decrease in the nature and seriousness of security incidents within the relevant period since the exemption has been granted.

By way of example, on a dedicated Schoolies cruise in December 2005, Carnival recorded 457 separate security incidents during one cruise alone. In December 2012, across all four Carnival vessels and

all cruises for that month, a total of 67 security incidents were recorded in relation to passengers of all ages.

(g) How frequently (if at all) did Carnival Australia waive the requirement that any passenger under the age of 19 years of age must be accompanied by a responsible adult? In each case, please advise the age of the passenger in respect of whom the policy was waived. Please also advise which cruise ship each passenger was

Having made enquiries, Carnival is aware of one instance in which it waived the responsible adult requirement in relation to a married couple under the age of 19 who indicated they did not intend to participate in Schoolies celebrations or any other unauthorised events.

(h) How frequently (if at all) did Carnival Australia increase the quota in clause 2(b) of the Unauthorised Events Policy?

Carnival increased its quota in clause 2(d) of the Unauthorised Events Policy on one occasion in January 2012. At this time, the quota was increased to accommodate 68 passengers under the age of 19 who were not accompanied by a responsible adult. To the best of Carnival's knowledge, it has not been necessary to consider increasing the quota in clause 2(d) on other occasions as Carnival has not had more than 60 unaccompanied passengers aged under 19 years make bookings during the relevant period.

(i) Has there been a decrease in the number or the seriousness of recorded incidents of inappropriate or anti-social behaviour during the period of the exemption, in comparison to reported incidents on Carnival cruise ships since 2007? Please provide a copy of Carnival's guidelines for the recording of inappropriate or anti-social behaviour. Please advise if there have been any changes to these guidelines over the last 12 months.

Carnival has observed a general decrease in the number of incidents reported during Schoolies Periods since 2007.

With respect to Carnival's guidelines for recording of inappropriate or anti-social behaviour, this is addressed in Carnival's Fleet Regulations in relation to excessive behaviour. Carnival notes that these Fleet Regulations are a highly confidential security document and public disclosure of this document may compromise Carnival's security processes and procedure. Should the Commission consider the contents of this document relevant to this application for a Further Exemption, we ask that the Commission contact us so that we may provide a general description of the document which is appropriate for public dissemination.

To the best of Carnival's knowledge, the Fleet Regulations have not been changed over the last 12 months.

We thank you for considering Carnival's application for a Further Exemption. Carnival would be happy to provide any further information, which may assist the Commission in considering this application.

Application by Carnival for Further Exemption under Section 44(2) of the Age Discrimination Act 2004 (Cth) (the Act)

We act for Carnival plc trading as Carnival Australia (Carnival), and refer to Carnival's previous applications to the Commission for exemptions under section 44(1) and section 44(2) of the Act.

We note as follows:

- The first exemption sought by Carnival was granted by the Commission on 21 December 2010 (Initial Exemption). The Initial Exemption commenced on 23 December 2010 for a period of 2.5 years, expiring on 22 June 2013.
- A subsequent exemption sought by Carnival was granted by the Commission on 15 November 2013 (Last Exemption). The Last Exemption also operated for a period of 2.5 years, expiring on 15 May 2016.

Our client now seeks a further exemption under section 44(2) of the Act for an additional period of 2.5 years and on the same terms and conditions as the Last Exemption (Further Exemption). For convenience, the terms and conditions of the Last Exemption, (as detailed in the Commission's decision of 15 November 2013), are set out at Schedule A.

In seeking the Further Exemption, Carnival does not admit that the Act applies to its operations, to the extent that these operations are conducted on cruise ships which are not within the jurisdiction of the laws of the Commonwealth of Australia. Carnival reserves all of its rights in this respect.

Background

Reasons for Original Application for Initial Exemption and Subsequent Application for Last Exemption

1.1 Carnival is Australia's leading cruise company and represents 7 cruise brands (including P&O Cruises Australia) in the Australian and New Zealand markets.

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- 1.2 Prior to obtaining the Initial Exemption in 2010, Carnival was experiencing a significant increase in the amount of alcohol-related security incidents involving large numbers of "Schoolies" on its cruises during the traditional Schoolies period of 1 November to 31 January (Schoolies Period). These incidents involved serious risks to the health and safety of passengers, crew, and also the Schoolies participants themselves.
- 1.3 Carnival attempted to reduce the number and severity of these incidents by obtaining advice from security experts and implementing stringent security measures. These included:
 - (a) increasing restrictions to the access and consumption of alcohol (including refusing to serve alcohol to persons involved in incidents, de-activating alcohol purchasing cards, providing unique wrist bands to passengers who were above-drinking age, and attempting to police the secondary supply of alcohol);
 - (b) tightening its policies and procedures in relation to the access and consumption of alcohol;
 - (c) enhancing the training and instruction of its crew in relation to the above procedures;
 - (d) increasing its pre-boarding and on-boarding searches for contraband alcohol: and
 - (e) increasing its security numbers and presence.
- 1.4 Despite these measures, Carnival continued to experience a high level of Schoolies alcohol-fuelled incidents. In particular, Schoolies participants continued to find methods of circumventing Carnival's security measures by either smuggling alcohol on board, obtaining alcohol through above-drinking age passengers or drinking to excess before boarding the ship. There were also incidents where Schoolies' participants pre-arranged fights and rioting which had not necessarily been fuelled by alcohol.
- 1.5 These incidents continued even after Carnival made an informed decision to discontinue promoting and operating summer voyages to school-leavers during the Schoolies Period. After 2006, there continued to be high levels of school leavers seeking to book cruises and Carnival continued to experience alcohol-fuelled and other "Schoolies" incidents. Schoolies participants would organise their own large-scale events on Carnival ships through viral emails and messaging.
- 1.6 As a result of the above, Carnival sought the Initial Exemption from the Commission on 7 April 2009 in order to restrict the ability of persons under 21 years of age to take part in cruises without a parent or guardian during the Schoolies Period.
- 1.7 Following significant compromise from Carnival, the Commission granted the Initial Exemption on 21 December 2010 which permitted Carnival to

lawfully restrict the ability of persons under 19 years of age to take part in cruises without a responsible adult during Schoolies Periods. The reduction in the age limit of Carnival's Initial Exemption to persons aged under 19 years was considered to be appropriate by the Commission in the circumstances and Carnival relies on the reasons published by the Commission as part of its decision of 21 December 2010. In seeking the Further Exemption, Carnival also relies on the reasons published by the Commission as part of its decision to grant the Last Exemption on 15 November 2013.

2. Reasons for Application for Further Exemption

- 2.1 Since the Commission granted the Initial Exemption and Last Exemption, Carnival has observed a significant and continued decrease in the number of alcohol-related security incidents during the Schoolies Period.
- 2.2 Carnival is of the view that such a decrease is attributable to the Initial Exemption granted by the Commission in 2010 and the Last Exemption granted by the Commission in 2013.

2.3 For example:

- (a) On a cruise in December 2005, Carnival recorded 457 separate security incidents on one vessel, during one cruise.
- (b) In December 2012, across all four Carnival vessels and across all cruises for that month, a total of 67 security incidents were recorded. Carnival also observed a general decrease in the number of customer service complaints from passengers onboard cruises during Schoolies Periods in relation to excessive behaviour engaged in by passengers aged under 19 years.
- (c) In December 2014, across six Australian home-ported Carnival vessels and across all cruises on those vessels for that month, a total of 18 security incidents were recorded.
- (d) In December 2015, across six Australian home-ported Carnival vessels and across all cruises for that month, a total of 5 security incidents were recorded.
- (e) During the period of the Last Exemption, Carnival continued to observe a general decrease in the number of customer service complaints from passengers onboard cruises during Schoolies Periods in relation to excessive behaviour engaged in by passengers aged under 19 years.
- 2.4 Carnival believes that the Initial Exemption and Last Exemption have served to:
 - (a) discourage Schoolies' participants from making bookings for the purpose of engaging in improper behaviour and under-age drinking;

- (b) reduce the likelihood of unmanageable large-scale Schoolies events organised through, for example, social networking; and
- (c) promote an understanding that Carnival cruises will not tolerate improper behaviour and under-age drinking on its cruise-ships as part of Schoolies celebrations.
- 2.5 Carnival also believes that the presence of a responsible adult acting as an authority figure for persons under the age of 19 during the Schoolies Period has served as an effective control mechanism to minimise incidents of underage drinking and other inappropriate behaviour.
- 2.6 Carnival wishes to continue to prioritise the health, safety and security of its passengers generally, and in particular during the Schoolies Period.
- 2.7 As Schoolies celebrations occur every year during the Schoolies Period,
 Carnival now seeks a Further Exemption in order to continue to lawfully
 restrict the ability of persons aged under 19 years of age to take part in cruises
 without a parent or guardian during the Schoolies Period.
- 2.8 In seeking the Further Exemption, Carnival again wishes to emphasise the primacy of the health and safety of its crew and passengers. These health and safety risks are compounded by the following factors:
 - (a) the onboard environment contains inherent risks, including risks associated with confined spaces and falling from heights or into the ocean;
 - (b) whilst at sea, Carnival ships are isolated from emergency medical services and there are limited onboard medical facilities;
 - (c) whilst at sea, Carnival cannot call upon an immediately available police presence;
 - (d) there are practical limitations to security personnel numbers which Carnival can accommodate on its cruises:
 - (e) on-board security personnel have limited rights to detain, search and control in terms of managing violent and improper behaviour, and there are limited facilities in terms of detaining passengers who are a threat to themselves and others;
 - (f) from past experience, Schoolies' participants have shown a remarkable ingenuity to circumvent procedures implemented by Carnival to restrict access to and the consumption of alcohol; and
 - (g) from past experience, Schoolies' celebrations have involved large groups organised through school or social networking, who then seek to run events/gatherings on board that are difficult to manage.

- 2.9 Carnival notes that the Commission, in publishing its:
 - (a) Notice to Grant a Temporary Exemption to Carnival on 21 December 2010 (which we enclose for your convenience) (2010 Notice); and
 - (b) Notice to Grant a Temporary Exemption to Carnival on 15 November 2013 (which we enclose for your convenience) (2013 Notice),

has provided reasons as to why it was appropriate to grant Carnival the Initial Exemption and the Last Exemption.

- 2.10 Carnival seeks to rely on these reasons in this application for a Further Exemption. The foundations for the Initial Exemption and the Last Exemption have not changed.
- 3. Key Criteria for Assessment of Application

2010 Temporary exemptions under the Age Discrimination Act Commission Guidelines ("Guidelines")

- 3.1 We refer to the Guidelines for applications for exemptions under section 44 of the Act which are published by the Commission. We note that these Guidelines stipulate a number of criteria to be addressed in applications for exemptions under section 44 of the Act.
- 3.2 Carnival has previously addressed a number of these criteria in its:
 - (a) application for the Initial Exemption dated 7 April 2009 (First Application); and
 - (b) application for the Last Exemption dated 21 June 2013 (Second Application).

Carnival relies on the submissions and evidence which it made in relation to the First Application and the Second Application. A copy of the First Application and Second Application are **enclosed** for your convenience.

What circumstances or activities are to be covered by the exemption?

- 3.3 In effect, Carnival seeks an extension of the Last Exemption on the same terms and conditions (see **Schedule A**). Carnival believes that the Last Exemption strikes an appropriate and reasonable balance between genuine health and safety concerns, and the rights of persons aged under 19 years of age.
- 3.4 Carnival seeks to restrict the ability of persons aged under 19 years of age to take part in Carnival cruises in the absence of a responsible adult during a limited period generally associated with Schoolies' celebrations. For part of this period, Carnival will permit a quota of 60 passengers per cruise under the age of 19 and not accompanied by a responsible adult.

- 3.5 Such a restriction will enable Carnival to control the size of events which are commonly associated with school leavers during the Schoolies Period, and increase its ability to manage these events (including alcohol consumption at these events) without a risk to health and safety.
- 3.6 Carnival wishes to have the following matters covered in the exemption.
 - (a) Carnival has implemented passage terms and conditions which seek to prevent events which may be large in scale and are associated with excessive and / or anti-social behaviour, including the abuse of alcohol (Unauthorised Events). Schoolies celebrations are an example of such events.
 - (b) Carnival wishes to impose the following restrictions based on age on its cruises commencing in Australia:
 - (i) For Carnival cruise ships departing an Australian port between 1 November and 7 January annually, passengers under the age of 19 must be accompanied by a responsible adult (Responsible Adult Requirement).
 - (A) Carnival may, at its sole discretion, waive the Responsible Adult Requirement where it is satisfied (in its sole and absolute discretion) that there is no risk that a specific passenger under the age of 19 will participate in an Unauthorised Event. Carnival may require any such passenger to sign a code of conduct or provide other commitments as a condition of boarding.
 - (B) Where the Responsible Adult Requirement is mentioned in Carnival's advertising or online booking system, Carnival will also state that it has retained a discretion to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement.
 - (C) This discretion may be exercised by Carnival on a case by case basis and Carnival is not required to make an assessment of each and every case, nor is Carnival required to engage in a review process of any decision in relation to its exercise of the discretion.
 - (ii) For Carnival cruise ships departing an Australian port between 8 January and 31 January annually, Carnival will permit a quota of 60 passengers per cruise who are aged under 19 years to take part in the cruise without being accompanied by a responsible adult. Once this quota is filled, Carnival will apply its Responsible Adult Requirement.

- (iii) This quota will not include infants and will also not include passengers under the age of 17, where Carnival believes there is no risk that the minor will participate in an Unauthorised Event. Carnival will otherwise determine how the quota is filled.
- (iv) Carnival may, in its sole and absolute discretion, increase this quota where it decides that the increase will not result in a risk to health, safety and security of the passengers and crew, having regard to the purpose of its policy.
- (v) Carnival will retain an absolute discretion to accept or reject any application/request for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement (where the quota is filled and it becomes applicable). It will not be required to engage in a review process of any decision in relation to its exercise of the discretion.
- 3.7 In respect of Clause 3.6(b)(i)(B), we provide the relevant extract from Carnival's online booking system below:

"Subject to applicable laws, for cruises departing from an Australian port between 1 November and 7 January, any guest under 19 years of age on the day they board the cruise, must travel in the same room as a responsible adult 19 years or older. In addition, from 8 January to 31 January, there is a limit on the number of guests under 19 years of age who can travel unaccompanied. Once the limit is reached, a responsible adult 19 years or older must travel in the same room. We can advise you at the time of booking whether the limit applies to your booking. P&O Cruises can waive the responsible adult requirement at our discretion. The responsible adult is accountable for guests under 19 years of age in their room for the duration of the cruise, and the 'Rights of the Captain' under clause 28 will be applied to anyone who displays disruptive behaviour."

Who will be affected by the application?

- 3.8 Generally, this Further Exemption will affect persons aged between 17 and 19 years who may wish to take part in Carnival cruises during the Schoolies Period in connection with celebrations as a result of their completion of school. However, this impact will only be for a limited period of time, and these persons will not necessarily be prevented from enjoying a cruise during this period. For instance:
 - (a) For the first period of approximately two months, this age group can still travel with Carnival provided that they are accompanied by an adult. Notably, Carnival may also waive this requirement in certain circumstances as set out in Clause 3.6(b)(i)(A) above.

(b) In the second period of approximately one month, an adult may not be required where Carnival has not filled its quota of 60 persons. Notably, Carnival may also increase this quota in certain circumstances as set out in Clause 3.6(b)(iv) above.

Is an exemption necessary?

- 3.9 As set out above, Carnival does not, in making this Application, admit that the Act applies to its activities in relation to leisure cruises upon vessels that are not "flagged" in the Australian jurisdiction. However, to the extent that the Commission is of the opinion that the Act does apply, it is possible that by continuing to observe a condition or requirement directly related to chronological age, Carnival's conduct may amount to unlawful discrimination under section 14 and/or 15 and 28(b) of the Act.
- 3.10 The exemptions in section 33 38, 40 41, 41A and 42 43 of the Act do not appear to apply to the conditions that Carnival continues to impose on persons during the Schoolies Period.
- 3.11 The exemption contained in section 39 of the Act extends to acts done in compliance with certain applicable Commonwealth, State and Territory acts and regulations.
- 3.12 As stated earlier in this Application, the principal reason why Carnival is seeking an extension of the Last Exemption is an ongoing concern for the health, safety and well-being of all passengers and staff on its vessels.
- 3.13 Carnival is of the view that the Further Exemption is necessary to enable Carnival to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the health, safety and security of its passengers during Schoolies Periods. As indicated earlier in this Application, Carnival has previously attempted to reduce the risks associated with Unauthorised Events by significantly enhancing security and alcohol control measures. However, these have not been successful for the reasons previously outlined in this Application.

Why should an exemption be granted?

- 3.14 We have addressed these reasons earlier in this Application.
- 3.15 We repeat that Carnival's Application for Further Exemption is motivated principally by concerns for the health, safety and security of its passengers and crew. In its past experience, Schoolies events have involved anti-social behaviour, abusive behaviour (including sexual and racial abuse), sexual harassment, dangerous skylarking, property damage, violence, fighting, drinking to excess, and substance abuse. This behaviour was often directed at other passengers and crew who were not participating in Schoolies events.
- 3.16 Carnival notes that since the Commission granted the Initial Exemption to Carnival in 2010, it observed a general decrease in the number of Unauthorised Events and reported incidents involving anti-social behaviour during Schoolies Periods. Carnival further notes that since the Commission

- granted the Last Exemption to Carnival in 2013, the incidence of Unauthorised Events and reported incidents involving anti-social behaviour during Schoolies Periods has continued along this downward trend.
- 3.17 As such, in seeking a Further Exemption, Carnival is not relying on negative stereotypes of school leavers and persons aged under 19 years. Rather, Carnival is relying on its own direct experiences of incidents during the Schoolies Period, and the comparison of the number of incidents after the Commission granted the Initial Exemption in 2010 and the Last Exemption in 2013. Carnival believes that, in order to continue to observe a general decrease in Unauthorised Events and reported incidents during Schoolies Periods, a Further Exemption is necessary.
- 3.18 Carnival notes that, in seeking a Further Exemption and in continuing to lawfully undertake the activities described in Clause 3.6 above, such actions are not inconsistent with the objectives of the Act. Carnival is not seeking to remove the ability of persons aged under 19 years to enjoy cruises during Schoolies Periods. Rather, Carnival wishes to ensure that such persons are appropriately supervised in order to reduce the likelihood of the types of unacceptable behaviour associated with Schoolies vacations.
- 3.19 Carnival also respectfully submits that a Further Exemption should be granted as it is appropriate on the grounds of public policy. As set out above, Carnival seeks a Further Exemption for the purpose of continuing to ensure the health, safety and security of its passengers during Schoolies periods, and also because Carnival does not wish to provide a forum for a rite of passage that is endemically associated with alcohol, anti-social behaviour and substance abuse.
- 3.20 Carnival also notes that a number of other hospitality providers in popular Schoolies locations continue to impose conditions on school leavers during Schoolies Periods. Such conditions include increased room and property bonds, and a requirement for a parent or guardian to supervise persons under the age of 21 years. Further, Carnival notes that some properties simply refuse persons under the age of 21 to book hotel rooms during Schoolies periods.
- 3.21 Further, Carnival refers to the 2010 Notice in which the Commission provided its reasons for granting Carnival's Initial Exemption. Carnival notes that the Commission has stated the following in the 2010 Notice:
 - (a) The secondary supply of alcohol, in contravention of Carnival's Responsible Service of Alcohol policies and obligations, raises a significant risk to the health, safety and security of passengers and the Responsible Adult Requirement is an appropriate response to that concern.
 - (b) Although the Commission was of the view that Carnival's policy to be encompassed by the Exemption allowed conduct which was allegedly inconsistent with the objects of the Act, this was not of

- itself a reason for the Commission to deny the application for an Exemption. Accordingly, the Commission considered the reasonableness of Carnival's policy, weighing up the nature and extent of the discriminatory effect against the reasons advanced in favour of the Exemption.
- (c) In taking into account a number of factors, including Carnival's legitimate concerns about controlling the consumption of alcohol on board its cruises, Carnival's policy encompassed by the Exemption was a reasonable measure which should be permitted.
- (d) Carnival sought to minimise as far as possible the discriminatory effect of its policy encompassed by the Exemption by reducing both the age range and the time period of the Responsible Adult Requirement and by making it subject to exceptions in appropriate cases.
- 3.22 The above reasons put forward by the Commission in the 2010 Notice are relevant to the present application for a Further Exemption. That is, the circumstances surrounding Carnival's Further Exemption are the same as those relating to the Initial Exemption application, which was granted by the Commission. As such, Carnival submits that such reasons should be considered by the Commission now in determining whether to grant Carnival a Further Exemption.
- 3.23 Further, Carnival refers to the 2013 Notice in which the Commission provided its reasons for granting Carnival's Last Exemption. Carnival notes that the Commission has stated the following in the 2013 Notice:
 - (a) Carnival's policy pursues a legitimate public policy goal and is appropriately targeted in its approach;
 - (b) the parameters set by Carnival in relation to the Responsible Adult Requirement make it an appropriately targeted approach in terms of age, limited periods of application and flexibility; and
 - (c) Carnival's policy is a reasonable measure having regard to the objects of the Act, and having weighed up the nature and extent of the discriminatory effect against the reasons in favour of the Exemption.
- 3.24 Finally, Carnival refers the Commission to the June 2013 Report commissioned by the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Social Policy and Legal Affairs titled "Troubled Waters Inquiry into the arrangements surrounding crimes committed at seas". Whilst the full report can be viewed via the link
 - http://www.aph.gov.au/parliamentary Business/Committees/House of Representatives Committees?url=spla/crimes%20at%20sea/report/fullreport.pdf, Carnival specifically draws the Commission's attention to the following clauses 4.75 and 4.76 where the Committee expressly indicates its support of Carnival's existing Exemption for the Schoolies Period:

"4.75 Carnival Australia's decision to ban schoolies cruises is a responsible one. However, there is a possibility that other operators will seek to take advantage of the 'schoolies' market and run such cruises in future. The Committee believes that operating 'schoolies cruises' is irresponsible, and expects that operators, informed by the tragedies of recent years, will refrain from doing so.

4.76 The Committee notes that Carnival Australia will soon have to reapply for an exemption for its schoolies-cruise ban. The Human Rights Commission must consider such an exemption on its merits, and the Committee is fully supportive of Carnival's decision to ban schoolies cruises."

Are there factors that may affect the processing of the Application?

- 3.25 In previous correspondence from the Commission dated 21 December 2010 and in the Conditions contained on page 6 of the 2013 Notice under the heading "Terms of the Exemption", the Commission foreshadowed that Carnival should provide certain additional information in an application for a Further Exemption. Such additional information is provided as follows:
 - (a) How many Carnival Australia cruise ships departed from an Australian port, and what was the date of their departure and the identifying ship number for each vessel?
 - Please refer to the tables at **Schedule B** in respect of Australian home-ported Carnival cruise ships.
 - (b) How many young people (aged 16-18 years old, inclusive) were on board each cruise ship? Please provide a breakdown of these passenger numbers on the basis of the age of the passenger.
 - Please refer to the tables at **Schedule B** in respect of Australian home-ported Carnival cruise ships.
 - (c) How many young people were accompanied by an adult, and how many were unaccompanied?
 - (d) Please refer to the tables at

Schedule C and Schedule D.

(e) In respect of each cruise, were there any recorded incidents of inappropriate or anti-social behaviour? Please provide details of the nature and seriousness of the incident and the age of the passengers involved in the incident.

Carnival keeps comprehensive and detailed records of every security incident which occurs on its vessels. Those records contain personal and potentially sensitive information which is highly confidential and occasionally the subject of police investigation.

Without disclosing potentially sensitive details in relation to individual incidents, Carnival notes that it has observed a continued decrease in the nature and seriousness of security incidents within the relevant period since the Initial Exemption and Last Exemption were granted.

By way of example, on a dedicated Schoolies cruise in December 2005, Carnival recorded 457 separate security incidents during one cruise alone. In December 2012, across all four Carnival vessels and all cruises for that month, a total of 67 security incidents were recorded in relation to passengers of all ages. In December 2015, across six Australian home-ported Carnival vessels and all cruises for that month, a total of 5 security incidents were recorded in relation to passengers of aged 16, 17, 18 and 19.

(f) During the period of the Last Exemption, how many applications/requests for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement did Carnival approve for the 1 November - 7 January period?

Having made enquiries, Carnival is aware of four instances in which it waived the Responsible Adult Requirement during the 1 November - 7 January period. These instances related to bookings made by passengers all under the age of 19 who indicated that they did not intend to participate in Schoolies celebrations or any other unauthorised events.

- (g) During the period of the Last Exemption:
 - (i) how many applications/requests did Carnival receive for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement during the 8 January - 31 January period, once the quota was filled;
 - (ii) on how many occasions and to what number did Carnival increase the quota?

To the best of Carnival's knowledge, it has not been necessary to consider increasing the quota as Carnival has not had more than 60

unaccompanied passengers aged under 19 years make bookings during the relevant period.

We thank you for considering Carnival's application for the Further Exemption. Carnival would be happy to provide any further information, which may assist the Commission in considering this application.

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Schedule A

Terms and Conditions of the Last Exemption (as set out in the decision of the Commission dated 15 November 2013)

Terms of the Exemption

Carnival may impose the following restrictions, based on age, in relation to its cruises commencing in Australia:

 For Carnival cruise-ships departing an Australian port between 1 November and 7 January annually, passengers who are under the age of 19 must be accompanied by a responsible adult (Responsible Adult Requirement).

Carnival may, at its sole discretion, waive the Responsible Adult Requirement where it is satisfied (in its sole and absolute discretion) that there is no risk that a specific passenger under the age of 19 will participate in an Unauthorised Event. Carnival may require any such passenger to sign a code of conduct or provide other commitments as a condition of boarding.

Where the Responsible Adult Requirement is mentioned in Carnival's advertising or online booking system, Carnival will also state that it has retained a discretion to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement.

This discretion may be exercised by Carnival on a case by case basis and Carnival is not required to make an assessment of each and every case, nor is Carnival required to engage in a review process of any decision in relation to its exercise of the discretion.

 For Carnival cruise-ships departing an Australian port between 8 January and 31 January annually, Carnival will permit a quota of 60 passengers per cruise who are under the age of 19 and not accompanied by a responsible adult. Once this quota is filled, Carnival will apply its Responsible Adult Requirement.

The quota will not include infants and will also not include passengers under the age of 17, where Carnival believes there is no risk that the minor will participate in an Unauthorised Event. Carnival will otherwise determine how the quota is filled.

Carnival may, in its sole and absolute discretion, increase this quota where it decides that the increase will not result in a risk to health, safety and security of the passengers and crew, having regard to the purpose of its policy.

Carnival will retain an absolute discretion to accept or reject any application/request for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement (where the quota is filled and it becomes applicable). It will not be required to engage in a review process of any decision in relation to its exercise of the discretion.

Conditions

This exemption is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) Carnival will report to the Commission at the end of this exemption period, how many applications/requests for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement it receives for the 1 November 7 January period and how many of these applications/requests it approves.
- (b) Carnival will report to the Commission at the end of this exemption period
 - (i) how many applications/requests it receives for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement during the 8 January 31 January period, once the quota is filled; and
 - (ii) on how many occasions and to what number it increases the quota.

- Australian home-ported Carnival cruise ships departed from an Australian port, their date of departure and identifying vessel number; and

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Application by Carnival for Further Exemption under Section 44(2) of the Age Discrimination Act 2004 (Cth) (the Act)

We act for Carnival plc trading as Carnival Australia (Carnival).

We refer to:

- Carnival's previous applications to the Commission for exemptions under section 44(1) and section 44(2) of the Act; and
- Carnival's current exemption under section 28 of the Act which was granted by the Commission on 22 June 2017 and expires on 22 June 2018 (Last Exemption).

We note as follows:

- The first exemption sought by Carnival was granted by the Commission on 21
 December 2010 (First Exemption). The First Exemption commenced on 23
 December 2010 for a period of 2.5 years, expiring on 22 June 2013.
- A subsequent exemption sought by Carnival was granted by the Commission on 15 November 2013 (Second Exemption). The Second Exemption also operated for a period of 2.5 years, expiring on 15 May 2016.
- As noted above, a third exemption sought by Carnival was granted by the Commission on 22 June 2017 (Last Exemption). The Last Exemption operated for a period of 1 year, and is due to expire on 22 June 2018.

Our client now seeks a further exemption under section 44(2) of the Act for an additional period of 2.5 years on substantially the same terms as the Last Exemption, (save for Carnival's request that the further exemption operate for a further period of 2.5 years as opposed to 1 year only) (Further Exemption). The proposed terms of the Further Exemption are set out at Schedule A.

Carnival considers that its age restricted cruises policy has been significantly successful in managing incidents of excessive behaviour. Carnival's intention in seeking the Further Exemption is to continue operating in a responsible manner in line with community expectations. Carnival also wishes to acknowledge the important role and contribution of the Commission in supporting Carnival's continued commitment to the health, safety and wellbeing of cruise passengers.

In seeking the Further Exemption, Carnival does not admit that the Act applies to its operations, to the extent that these operations are conducted on cruise ships which are not within the jurisdiction of the laws of the Commonwealth of Australia. Carnival reserves all of its rights in this respect.

1. Background

Reasons for Original Application for First Exemption and Subsequent Applications for Second Exemption and Last Exemption

- 1.1 Carnival is Australia's leading cruise company and represents 7 cruise brands (including P&O Cruises Australia) in the Australian and New Zealand markets.
- 1.2 Prior to obtaining the First Exemption in 2010, Carnival was experiencing a significant increase in the amount of alcohol-related security incidents involving large numbers of "Schoolies" on its cruises during the traditional Schoolies period of 1 November to 31 January (Schoolies Period). These incidents involved serious risks to the health and safety of passengers, crew, and also the Schoolies participants themselves.
- 1.3 Carnival attempted to reduce the number and severity of these incidents by obtaining advice from security experts and implementing stringent security measures. These included:
 - (a) increasing restrictions to the access and consumption of alcohol (including refusing to serve alcohol to persons involved in incidents, deactivating alcohol purchasing cards, providing unique wrist bands to passengers who were above-drinking age, and attempting to police the secondary supply of alcohol);
 - (b) tightening its policies and procedures in relation to the access and consumption of alcohol;
 - (c) enhancing the training and instruction of its crew in relation to the above procedures;
 - (d) increasing its pre-boarding and on-boarding searches for contraband alcohol; and
 - (e) increasing its security numbers and presence.
- 1.4 Despite these measures, Carnival continued to experience a high level of Schoolies alcohol-fuelled incidents. In particular, Schoolies participants continued to find methods of circumventing Carnival's security measures by

- either smuggling alcohol on board, obtaining alcohol through above-drinking age passengers or drinking to excess before boarding the ship. There were also incidents where Schoolies participants pre-arranged fights and rioting which had not necessarily been fuelled by alcohol.
- 1.5 These incidents continued even after Carnival made an informed decision to discontinue promoting and operating summer voyages to school-leavers during the Schoolies Period. After 2006, there continued to be high levels of school leavers seeking to book cruises and Carnival continued to experience alcohol-fuelled and other "Schoolies" incidents. Schoolies participants would organise their own large-scale events on Carnival ships through viral emails and messaging.
- 1.6 As a result of the above, Carnival sought the First Exemption from the Commission on 7 April 2009 in order to restrict the ability of persons under 21 years of age to take part in cruises without a parent or guardian during the Schoolies Period.
- 1.7 Following significant compromise from Carnival, the Commission granted the First Exemption on 21 December 2010 which permitted Carnival to lawfully restrict the ability of persons under 19 years of age to take part in cruises without a responsible adult during Schoolies Periods. The reduction in the age limit of Carnival's First Exemption to persons aged under 19 years was considered to be appropriate by the Commission in the circumstances and Carnival relies on the reasons published by the Commission as part of its decision of 21 December 2010. In seeking the Further Exemption, Carnival also relies on the reasons published by the Commission as part of its decision to grant the Second Exemption on 15 November 2013 and the Last Exemption on 22 June 2017.

2. Reasons for Application for Further Exemption

- 2.1 Since the Commission granted the First Exemption, Carnival has observed a significant decrease in the number of alcohol-related security incidents during the Schoolies Period. Alcohol-related security incidents are incidents involving excessive and unacceptable behaviour where alcohol is a contributing factor.
- 2.2 Carnival is of the view that such a decrease is attributable to the First Exemption granted by the Commission in 2010, the Second Exemption granted by the Commission in 2013 and the Last Exemption granted by the Commission in 2017.

2.3 For example:

- (a) On a cruise in December 2005, Carnival recorded 457 separate security incidents on one vessel, during one cruise.
- (b) In December 2012, across all four Carnival vessels and across all cruises for that month, a total of 67 security incidents were recorded. Carnival also observed a general decrease in the number of customer service complaints from passengers onboard cruises during Schoolies Periods in

- relation to excessive behaviour engaged in by passengers aged under 19 years.
- (c) In December 2014, across six Australian home-ported Carnival vessels and across all cruises on those vessels for that month, a total of 18 security incidents were recorded.
- (d) In December 2015, across six Australian home-ported Carnival vessels and across all cruises on those vessels for that month, a total of 5 security incidents were recorded.
- (e) During the periods of the Second Exemption and the Last Exemption, the reduced number of security incidents continued. For instance, a total of 13 security incidents were recorded in December 2017 across seven Australian home-ported vessels and across all cruises on those vessels for that month.
- 2.4 Carnival believes that each of the First, Second and Last Exemptions have served to:
 - (a) discourage Schoolies participants from making bookings for the purpose of engaging in improper behaviour and under-age drinking;
 - (b) reduce the likelihood of unmanageable large-scale Schoolies events organised through, for example, social networking; and
 - (c) promote an understanding that Carnival cruises will not tolerate improper behaviour and under-age drinking on its cruise-ships as part of Schoolies celebrations.
- 2.5 Carnival also believes that the presence of a responsible adult acting as an authority figure for persons under the age of 19 during the Schoolies Period has served as an effective control mechanism to minimise incidents of underage drinking and other inappropriate behaviour.
- 2.6 Carnival wishes to continue to prioritise the health, safety and security of its passengers generally, and in particular during the Schoolies Period.
- 2.7 As Schoolies celebrations continue to occur every year during the Schoolies Period, Carnival seeks a Further Exemption in order to continue to lawfully restrict the ability of persons aged under 19 years to take part in cruises without a parent or guardian during the Schoolies Period.
- 2.8 Carnival considers that the Responsible Adult Requirement (as detailed below) is a key feature of its broader package of measures designed to minimise excessive behaviour. In relation to incidents of excessive behaviour among guests aged 17 to 19 years specifically during the traditional 'Schoolies' period (i.e. from 1 November to 31 January annually), Carnival believes that the Responsible Adult Requirement has driven the decline in security incidents.

- 2.9 As evidenced by the figures in Clause 2.3 above, Carnival now experiences a small handful of security incidents across its Australian home ported ships each month during the Schoolies Period. For completeness, Carnival does not consider these incidents to be attributable to large scale Unauthorised Events or excessive behaviour engaged in by groups.
- 2.10 In seeking the Further Exemption, Carnival again wishes to emphasise the primacy of the health and safety of its crew and passengers. These health and safety risks are compounded by the following factors which remain as relevant today as they were at the time Carnival applied for the First Exemption:
 - (a) the onboard environment contains inherent risks, including risks associated with confined spaces and open spaces;
 - (b) whilst at sea, Carnival ships do not have immediate access to shoreside medical facilities or emergency services. Onboard medical centres are staffed with skilled medical professionals but the services offered are naturally more limited than those offered at shoreside hospitals;
 - (c) whilst at sea, Carnival cannot call upon an immediately available police presence and Australian police will not have universal jurisdiction;
 - (d) although onboard security personnel are highly trained and proactive, there are practical limitations to security personnel numbers which Carnival can accommodate on its cruises;
 - (e) on-board security personnel have limited rights to detain, search and control in terms of managing violent and improper behaviour, and there are limited facilities in terms of detaining passengers who are a threat to themselves and others:
 - (f) from past experience, Schoolies participants have shown a remarkable ingenuity to circumvent procedures implemented by Carnival to restrict access to and the consumption of alcohol; and
 - (g) from past experience, Schoolies celebrations have involved large groups organised through school or social networking, who then seek to run events/gatherings on board that are difficult to manage.
- 2.11 Carnival notes that the Commission, in publishing its:
 - (a) Notice to Grant a Temporary Exemption to Carnival on 21 December 2010 (2010 Notice);
 - (b) Notice to Grant a Temporary Exemption to Carnival on 15 November 2013 (2013 Notice);
 - (c) Notice to Grant a Temporary Exemption to Carnival on 22 June 2017 (2017 Notice),

has provided reasons as to why it was appropriate to grant Carnival the First, Second and Last Exemptions. We **enclose** each of these Notices for your convenience as **Schedule B**.

2.12 Carnival seeks to rely on these reasons in this application for a Further Exemption. The foundation for Carnival applying for, and being granted the First, Second and Last Exemptions has not changed.

3. Key Criteria for Assessment of Application

2010 Temporary exemptions under the Age Discrimination Act Commission Guidelines (Guidelines)

- 3.1 We refer to the Guidelines for applications for exemptions under section 44 of the Act which are published by the Commission. We note that these Guidelines stipulate a number of criteria to be addressed in applications for exemptions under section 44 of the Act.
- 3.2 Carnival has previously addressed a number of these criteria in its:
 - (a) application for the First Exemption dated 7 April 2009 (First Application);
 - (b) application for the Second Exemption dated 21 June 2013 (Second Application); and
 - (c) application for the Last Exemption dated 28 October 2016 (Last Application).

Carnival relies on the submissions and evidence which it made in relation to the First, Second and Last Applications. A copy of the First, Second and Last Applications are **enclosed** for your convenience at **Schedule C**.

What circumstances or activities are to be covered by the exemption?

- 3.3 In effect, Carnival seeks an extension of the Last Exemption on substantially the same terms (see **Schedule A**); save for the Further Exemption operating for a further period of 2.5 years as opposed to 1 year only. Carnival believes that the Last Exemption strikes an appropriate and reasonable balance between genuine health and safety concerns, and the rights of persons aged under 19 years of age.
- 3.4 Carnival seeks to restrict the ability of persons aged under 19 years of age to take part in Carnival cruises in the absence of a responsible adult during a limited period generally associated with Schoolies celebrations. For part of this period, Carnival will permit a quota of 60 passengers per cruise under the age of 19 and not accompanied by a responsible adult.
- 3.5 Such a restriction will continue to enable Carnival to control the size of events which are commonly associated with school leavers during the Schoolies Period, and increase its ability to manage these events (including alcohol consumption at these events) without a risk to health and safety.

- 3.6 Carnival wishes to have the following matters covered in the Further Exemption:
 - (a) Carnival has implemented passage terms and conditions which seek to prevent events which may be large in scale and are associated with excessive and/or anti-social behaviour, including the abuse of alcohol (Unauthorised Events). Schoolies celebrations are an example of such events.
 - (b) Carnival wishes to impose the following restrictions, based on age, in relation to its cruises commencing in Australia:
 - (i) For Carnival cruise ships departing an Australian port between 1 November and 7 January annually, passengers who are under the age of 19 must be accompanied by a responsible adult (Responsible Adult Requirement).
 - (A) Carnival may, at its sole and absolute discretion, waive the Responsible Adult Requirement where it is satisfied that a specific passenger under the age of 19 does not present a risk of participating in an Unauthorised Event. Carnival may require any such passenger to sign a code of conduct or provide other commitments as a condition of boarding.
 - (B) Where the Responsible Adult Requirement is mentioned in Carnival's advertising or online booking system, Carnival will state that it has retained a discretion to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement. Carnival will also state that queries/requests for review in relation to a waiver application decision can be made through its complaints handling process and will publish information about this process.
 - (C) Additionally, Carnival will:
 - assess each application for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement that it receives;
 - (2) continue to apply its current complaints handling mechanism to allow applicants who are dissatisfied with Carnival's initial assessment on a waiver application to further engage with Carnival on the matter, and Carnival will participate in that process in good faith.
 - (ii) For Carnival cruise ships departing an Australian port between 8 January and 31 January annually, Carnival will permit a quota of 60 passengers per cruise who are aged under 19 years to take part in the cruise without being accompanied by a responsible adult.

Once this quota is filled, Carnival will apply its Responsible Adult Requirement.

- (A) This quota will not include infants and will also not include passengers under the age of 17, where Carnival believes there is no risk that the minor will participate in an Unauthorised Event. Carnival will otherwise determine how the quota is filled.
- (B) Carnival may, in its sole and absolute discretion, increase this quota where it decides that the increase will not result in a risk to health, safety and security of the passengers and crew, having regard to the purpose of its policy.
- (C) Carnival will assess each application for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement (where the quota is filled and it becomes applicable).
- (D) Carnival will continue to apply its current complaints handling mechanism to allow applicants who are dissatisfied with Carnival's initial assessment on a waiver application to further engage with Carnival on the matter, and Carnival will participate in that process in good faith.
- 3.7 In respect of Clause 3.6(b)(i)(B), we provide the relevant extract from Carnival's online booking system below:

"Subject to applicable laws, for cruises departing from an Australian port between 1 November and 7 January, any guest under 19 years of age on the day they board the cruise, must travel in the same room as a responsible adult 19 years or older. In addition, from 8 January to 31 January, there is a limit on the number of guests under 19 years of age who can travel unaccompanied. Once the limit is reached, a responsible adult 19 years or older must travel in the same room. We can advise you at the time of booking whether the limit applies to your booking. P&O Cruises can waive the responsible adult requirement at our discretion. Any requests for review of a waiver application decision can be made by emailing feedback@pocruises.com.au. The responsible adult is accountable for guests under 19 years of age in their room for the duration of the cruise, and the 'Travel Restrictions and Rights of the Captain' under clause 28 will be applied to anyone who displays disruptive behaviour."

Who will be affected by the application?

3.8 Generally, this Further Exemption will affect persons aged between 17 and 19 years who may wish to take part in Carnival cruises during the Schoolies Period in connection with celebrations as a result of their completion of school. However, this impact will only be for a limited period of time, and these persons

will not necessarily be prevented from enjoying a cruise during this period. For instance:

- (a) For the first period of approximately two months, this age group can still travel with Carnival provided that they are accompanied by an adult. Notably, Carnival may also waive this requirement in certain circumstances as set out in Clause 3.6(b)(i)(A) above.
- (b) In the second period of approximately one month, an adult may not be required where Carnival has not filled its quota of 60 persons. Notably, Carnival may also increase this quota in certain circumstances as set out in Clause 3.6(b)(ii)(B) above.

Is an exemption necessary?

- As set out above, Carnival does not, in making this Application, admit that the Act applies to its activities in relation to leisure cruises upon vessels that are not "flagged" in the Australian jurisdiction. However, to the extent that the Commission is of the opinion that the Act does apply, it is possible that by continuing to observe a condition or requirement directly related to chronological age, Carnival's conduct may amount to unlawful discrimination under section 14 and/or 15 and 28(b) of the Act.
- 3.10 The exemptions in section 33 38, 40 41, 41A and 42 43 of the Act do not appear to apply to the conditions that Carnival continues to impose on persons during the Schoolies Period.
- 3.11 The exemption contained in section 39 of the Act extends to acts done in compliance with certain applicable Commonwealth, State and Territory acts and regulations.
- 3.12 As stated earlier in this Application, the principal reason why Carnival is seeking an extension of the Last Exemption is an ongoing concern for the health, safety and well-being of all passengers and staff on its vessels.
- 3.13 Carnival is of the firm view that an exemption in the form of the Further Exemption continues to be necessary to enable Carnival to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the health, safety and security of its passengers and crew during Schoolies Periods. As indicated earlier in this Application, Carnival has previously attempted to reduce the risks associated with Unauthorised Events by significantly enhancing security and alcohol control measures. However, these have not been successful for the reasons previously outlined in this Application.

Why should an exemption be granted?

- 3.14 We have addressed these reasons earlier in this Application.
- 3.15 We repeat that Carnival's application for Further Exemption is motivated principally by concerns for the health, safety and security of its passengers and crew. In its past experience, Schoolies events have involved anti-social behaviour, abusive behaviour (including sexual and racial abuse), sexual

- harassment, dangerous skylarking, property damage, violence, fighting, drinking to excess, and substance abuse. This behaviour was often directed at other passengers and crew who were not participating in Schoolies events.
- 3.16 Carnival notes that since the Commission granted the First Exemption to Carnival in 2010, it observed a general decrease in the number of Unauthorised Events and reported incidents involving anti-social behaviour during Schoolies Periods. Carnival further notes that since the Commission granted the Last Exemption to Carnival in 2017, the incidence of Unauthorised Events and reported incidents involving anti-social behaviour during Schoolies Periods has continued to remain low.
- 3.17 As such, in seeking a Further Exemption, Carnival is not relying on negative stereotypes of school leavers and persons aged under 19 years. Rather, Carnival is relying on its own direct experiences of incidents during the Schoolies Period, and the comparison of the number of incidents after the Commission granted the First Exemption in 2010, the Second Exemption in 2013 and the Last Exemption in 2017. Carnival believes that, in order to continue to observe a reduced number of Unauthorised Events and reported incidents during Schoolies Periods, a Further Exemption is necessary.
- 3.18 Carnival notes that, in seeking a Further Exemption and in continuing to lawfully undertake the activities described in Clause 3.6 above, such actions are not inconsistent with the objectives of the Act. Carnival is not seeking to remove the ability of persons aged under 19 years to enjoy cruises during Schoolies Periods. Rather, Carnival wishes to ensure that such persons are appropriately supervised in order to reduce the likelihood of the types of unacceptable behaviour associated with Schoolies vacations.
- 3.19 Carnival also respectfully submits that a Further Exemption should be granted as it is appropriate on the grounds of public policy. As set out above, Carnival seeks a Further Exemption for the purpose of continuing to ensure the health, safety and security of its passengers during Schoolies Periods, and also because Carnival does not wish to provide a forum for a rite of passage that is endemically associated with alcohol, anti-social behaviour and substance abuse.
- 3.20 Carnival also notes that a number of other hospitality providers in popular Schoolies locations continue to impose conditions on school leavers during Schoolies Periods. Such conditions include increased room and property bonds, and a requirement for a parent or guardian to supervise persons under the age of 21 years. Further, Carnival notes that some properties simply refuse persons under the age of 21 to book hotel rooms during Schoolies Periods.
- 3.21 Further, Carnival refers to the 2010 Notice in which the Commission provided its reasons for granting Carnival's First Exemption. Carnival notes that the Commission has stated the following in the 2010 Notice:
 - (a) The secondary supply of alcohol, in contravention of Carnival's Responsible Service of Alcohol policies and obligations, raises a significant risk to the health, safety and security of passengers and the

- Responsible Adult Requirement is an appropriate response to that concern.
- (b) Although the Commission was of the view that Carnival's policy to be encompassed by the Exemption allowed conduct which was allegedly inconsistent with the objects of the Act, this was not of itself a reason for the Commission to deny the application for an Exemption. Accordingly, the Commission considered the reasonableness of Carnival's policy, weighing up the nature and extent of the discriminatory effect against the reasons advanced in favour of the Exemption.
- (c) In taking into account a number of factors, including Carnival's legitimate concerns about controlling the consumption of alcohol on board its cruises, Carnival's policy encompassed by the Exemption was a reasonable measure which should be permitted.
- (d) Carnival sought to minimise as far as possible the discriminatory effect of its policy encompassed by the Exemption by reducing both the age range and the time period of the Responsible Adult Requirement and by making it subject to exceptions in appropriate cases.
- 3.22 The above reasons put forward by the Commission in the 2010 Notice continue to be relevant to the present application for a Further Exemption. That is, the circumstances surrounding Carnival's Further Exemption are the same as those relating to the First Application which was granted by the Commission. As such, Carnival submits that such reasons should be considered by the Commission now in determining whether to grant Carnival a Further Exemption.
- 3.23 Additionally, Carnival refers the Commission to the June 2013 Report commissioned by the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Social Policy and Legal Affairs titled "Troubled Waters Inquiry into the arrangements surrounding crimes committed at sea". Whilst the full report can be viewed via the link
 - http://www.aph.gov.au/parliamentary Business/Committees/House of Represent atives Committees?url=spla/crimes%20at%20sea/report/fullreport.pdf, Carnival specifically draws the Commission's attention to the following clauses 4.75 and 4.76 where the Committee expressly indicates its support of Carnival's (then) existing Exemption for the Schoolies Period:
 - "4.75 Carnival Australia's decision to ban schoolies cruises is a responsible one. However, there is a possibility that other operators will seek to take advantage of the 'schoolies' market and run such cruises in future. The Committee believes that operating 'schoolies cruises' is irresponsible, and expects that operators, informed by the tragedies of recent years, will refrain from doing so.
 - 4.76 The Committee notes that Carnival Australia will soon have to reapply for an exemption for its schoolies-cruise ban. The Human Rights Commission must consider such an exemption on its merits, and the

Committee is fully supportive of Carnival's decision to ban schoolies cruises "

- 3.24 Further, Carnival refers to the 2017 Notice in which the Commission provided its reasons for granting Carnival's Last Exemption. Carnival notes that the Commission has stated the following in the 2017 Notice:
 - (a) Carnival's policy pursues a legitimate public policy goal and is appropriately targeted in its approach;
 - (b) the parameters set by Carnival in relation to the Responsible Adult Requirement make it an appropriately targeted approach in terms of age, limited periods of application and flexibility; and
 - (c) Carnival's policy is a reasonable measure having regard to the objects of the Act, and having weighed up the nature and extent of the discriminatory effect against the reasons in favour of the Exemption.

Are there factors that may affect the processing of the Application, (including whether there is a continuing necessity for an exemption under the Act)?

- 3.25 In previous correspondence from the Commission dated 22 June 2017 and in the Conditions contained on page 7 of the 2017 Notice under the heading "Terms and conditions of the Exemption", the Commission requested that Carnival provide a comprehensive report to the Commission by no later than 30 March 2018 as to the following matters:
 - (a) how many applications/requests for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement it receives for the 1 November 2017 to 7 January 2018 period and how many of these applications/requests it approves;
 - (b) how many applications/requests it receives for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement during the 8 January 2018 to 31 January 2018 period, once the quota is filled;
 - (c) on how many occasions and to what number it increased the quota;
 - (d) how many applicants utilised Carnival's complaints handling process to engage with Carnival further on waiver application decisions;
 - (e) any changes to the number or level of Unauthorised Events;
 - (f) analysis and evidence that any reduction in Unauthorised Events are a direct result of the restrictions based on age;
 - (g) whether, and why, the restrictions continue to be necessary to reduce Unauthorised Events;
 - (h) any alternate methods/strategies to reduce Unauthorised Events that it has implemented or trialled; and

- (i) the success or otherwise of those methods/strategies,(altogether, the Requested Report).
- 3.26 Carnival complied with the Commission's request and submitted the Requested Report on 29 March 2018. A copy of the Requested Report and accompanying email to the Commission is enclosed as **Schedule D**.
- 3.27 Carnival relies on the matters addressed in the Requested Report in its application for a Further Exemption. In light of the matters contained in the Requested Report, Carnival remains of the firm view that:
 - (a) there is an ongoing necessity for an exemption from the Act in the form of the Further Exemption; and
 - (b) there are no other practical means of achieving Carnival's aim to minimise and/or prevent Unauthorised Events outside of being granted an exemption in the form of the Further Exemption sought.
- 3.28 In making this application for Further Exemption, Carnival firmly believes that:
 - (a) there continues to be a strong demand for Schoolies cruises; and
 - (b) cruises operating during the Schoolies Period, (albeit they are not promoted as "Schoolies Cruises") continue to be a popular option for school leavers when choosing a destination for their end of school celebrations.
- 3.29 To demonstrate a clear example of this, as recently as 16 February 2018

 (https://www.cruisecritic.com.au/news/news.cfm?ID=8406) it was reported on 'Cruise Critic' that a 'Schoolies Cruise' had been advertised and promoted by a third party supplier (SureThing Travel) via the Royal Caribbean cruise line brand (Royal Caribbean) without Royal Caribbean's knowledge or authorisation. (We are instructed that Cruise Critic is an independent cruise review community website which also has information for cruise passengers written by editors, news on cruising and a public forum).
- 3.30 Carnival further notes that the same third party supplier, SureThing Travel, is currently advertising Schoolies Packages & Deals for 2018 and 2019, including Schoolies Cruises for 2018. In promoting a Schoolies Cruise on its website which is available to book now, the description of "Inclusions" includes the following (our own emphasis added):

"Access to Parties

Access to Events

All Meals Included

Selected Rooming and Dining

Schoolies Registration

24 Hour Access to the Schoolies Hotline

Access to the Official Schoolies – Cruise group in Advance (To check out who's coming)

Access to Direct Pricing for Great Deals on Unlimited Drinks Packages (18+ only)

Free Exclusive Official Sure Thing Schoolies Cap

Free On Board Credit (Comes with some Cruise packages)"

- 3.31 Copies of the Cruise Critic article dated 16 February 2018 and printouts dated 20 June 2018 from the SureThing Travel website relating to their "Schoolies Cruise" product are enclosed as **Schedule E**. We also note that SureThing Travel describes itself on its website as "Australia's leader in travel for the 16 to 30 age group" (https://surething.com.au/about/) offering "Schoolies (16 to 18 years)" packages, including the "Schoolies Cruise".
- 3.32 This most recent example emphasises the continuing concern of Carnival that large group bookings could turn certain cruises operating in the months from November to January into 'de facto' Schoolies cruises thus impacting the safety and enjoyment of other guests. Carnival's product offerings are designed to be family friendly (particularly its cruises which operate during designated school holiday periods) and Schoolies events have proven to be inconsistent with this.
- 3.33 In light of its past experience, Carnival has no intention of promoting its cruises to school leavers as designated Schoolies cruises in the foreseeable future. Notwithstanding, without an exemption in the form of the Further Exemption, Carnival will have no control over the promotion by third parties (such as travel agents) of its cruises which operate during the Schoolies Period and the impacts of alcohol related security incidents involving Schoolies on its passengers and crew.
- 3.34 Finally, we note that in previous applications for exemption, the Commission has requested that Carnival provide certain additional information such as:
 - (a) How many Carnival Australia cruise ships departed from an Australian port, and what was the date of their departure and the identifying ship number for each vessel?
 - (b) How many young people (aged 16-18 years old, inclusive) were on board each cruise ship? Please provide a breakdown of these passenger numbers on the basis of the age of the passenger;
 - (c) How many young people were accompanied by an adult, and how many were unaccompanied;

(altogether, the Requested Data).

3.35 For completeness, and to assist the Commission consider Carnival's application for Further Exemption, Carnival provides updated Requested Data for the 2016/2017 and 2017/2018 Schoolies Periods at Schedules F, G and H.

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Schedule A

Terms of the Last Exemption (as set out at 5.1(a) of the decision of the Commission dated 22 June 2017)

Terms of the Exemption

Carnival may impose the following restrictions, based on age, in relation to its cruises commencing in Australia:

 For Carnival cruise-ships departing an Australian port between 1 November and 7 January annually, passengers who are under the age of 19 must be accompanied by a responsible adult (Responsible Adult Requirement).

Carnival may, at its sole and absolute discretion, waive the Responsible Adult Requirement where it is satisfied that a specific passenger under the age of 19 does not present a risk of participating in an Unauthorised Event.

Carnival may require any such passenger to sign a code of conduct or provide other commitments as a condition of boarding.

Where the Responsible Adult Requirement is mentioned in Carnival's advertising or online booking system, Carnival will state that it has retained a discretion to waive the Responsible Adult Requirement. Carnival will also state that queries/requests for review in relation to a waiver application decision can be made through its complaints handling process and will publish information about this process.

Carnival will assess each application for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement that it receives.

Carnival will continue its current complaints handling mechanism to allow applicants who are dissatisfied with Carnival's initial assessment on a waiver application to further engage with Carnival on the matter, and Carnival will participate in that process in good faith.

2. For Carnival cruise-ships departing an Australian port between 8 January and 31 January annually, Carnival will permit a quota of 60 passengers per cruise who are under the age of 19 and not accompanied by a responsible adult. Once this quota is filled, Carnival will apply its Responsible Adult Requirement.

The quota will not include infants and will also not include passengers under the age of 17, where Carnival believes that the minor does not present a risk of participating in an Unauthorised Event. Carnival will otherwise determine how the quota is filled.

Carnival may, in its sole and absolute discretion, increase this quota where it decides that the increase will not result in a risk to health, safety and security of the passengers and crew, having regard to the purpose of its policy.

Carnival will assess each application for waiver of the Responsible Adult Requirement (where the quota is filled and it becomes applicable).

Carnival will continue its current complaints handling mechanism to allow applicants who are dissatisfied with Carnival's initial assessment on a waiver application to further engage with Carnival on the matter, and Carnival will participate in that process in good faith.

- Australian home-ported Carnival cruise ships departed from an Australian port, their date of departure and identifying vessel number; and

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Unauthorised Schoolies Cruises Offered on Two Australian Cruise Ships

(7 p.m. AEST) - Previously axed in Australia, schoolies cruises have been organised on two Royal Caribbean ships by a local travel agency. Sure Thing Travel is selling three cruises for high school-leavers, or "schoolies", with access to parties, events ar "direct pricing for great deals on unlimited drinks packages".

But the party cruises may not be a sure thing, after all, as the cruise line has not approved the promotion. A Royal Caribbean spokesperson confirmed today that it is not offering schoolies cruises or charters in Australia.

Cruise Critic became aware of the schoolies cruises when a member warned others on our Australia & NZ Cruisers board (
http://boards.cruisecritic.com.au/forumdisplay.php?f=712) about an upcoming sailing on Ovation of the Seas. **rkmw** posted: "Th
five-night 23rd November cruise to Hobart is being advertised as a schoolies cruise so if anyone is thinking of booking it,
beware."

Cruise Critic member **megsie**, who is booked on the cruise, said: "As long as there is still a mixed age group onboard, we'll be happy but hopefully not overloaded with 16-18 year olds. As a family we've decided to wait a little while before deciding to cancel."

Schoolies cruises were once a rite of passage for Aussie students, with more than 1,500 school-leavers on each trip, according to a report in the Sydney Morning Herald in 2006. The popular cruises were run by P&O since the 1990s but the line discontinued them in 2007.

While P&O does not have an official 'schoolies ban', the line's website states "for cruises departing from an Australian port between 1 November and 7 January, any guest under 19 years of age on the day they board the cruise, must travel in the same room as a responsible adult 19 years or older".

P&O also limits the number of guests under 19 who can travel unaccompanied from 8 January to 31 January.

The three cruises marketed by Sure Thing include Ovation of the Seas' Sydney departure on 23 November 2018 and two 11-night cruises on Explorer of the Seas also departing Sydney on 16 and 29 November 2018.

A Royal Caribbean spokesperson told us the line is engaged in discussions with Sure Thing regarding the unauthorised theme cruises.

Cruise Critic contacted Sure Thing for comment but they had not responded at the time of writing.

According to an email sent to those who register, at least one passenger in each cabin must be aged 18 or older. The email fror Sure Thing states: "A Letter of Permission must be filled by each guest who will be under 18 at time of travel (signed by a paren to authorise legal guardianship to the 18-year-old friend who is rooming with them for the cruise)."
